There are three things you can do to fight cancer, according to the Canadian Cancer Society: be alert to the symptoms of cancer, information on which is available from your local Society unit; report any new and unusual symptoms to your doctor—

only he can determine if you have cancer and prescribe the proper treatment; and contribute to the appeal of the Canadian Cancer Society to finance its three-pronged attack on cancer by means of research, public education and assistance to cancer patients.

**New Color for Truck Plates**

For the first time in seven years, some of Ontario's licence plates next week will have colours other than black and white.

Commercial vehicles - including boat trailers and other small trailers are eligible for a new system of three month licences that go on sale Monday, March 25th. The different quarters of the year will have different colours on the plates, beginning with a white-on-red combination for the April-to-June quarter.

Other quarterly licences will be white on green for the second quarter, beginning July 1; and black on yellow for the

third quarter, beginning Oct. 1. Plates for final quarter, beginning next January 1, will be the same as the full year licences, white on black.

For all commercial vehicles the licence year has been changed to begin on April 1, and full year commercial licences have been on sale since February 28. Transport Minister James Auld reminded owners of commercial vehicles that they now have 3 choices when buying their licences:

1. They can buy commercial licences for the full 12-month period.
2. Beginning March 25, they can buy commercial licences for one quarter of the year at a time. The first quarter covers the months of April, May and June. For the second quarter (July, August and September) licences will go on sale June 24; for the third quarter (October, November and December) they will go on sale September 23; and for the final quarter January, February and March of 1964 they will go on sale December 23rd.
3. They can buy licences for the final three-quarters of the licence year (from July 1 to the end of March, 1964); or for the final half of the licence year (beginning October 1).

Owners of small trailers who use these vehicles for only part of the year, for taking the boat to and from the cottage, for example, are among those who can save money by buying plates for only one or two of the quarters, Mr. Auld pointed out.
