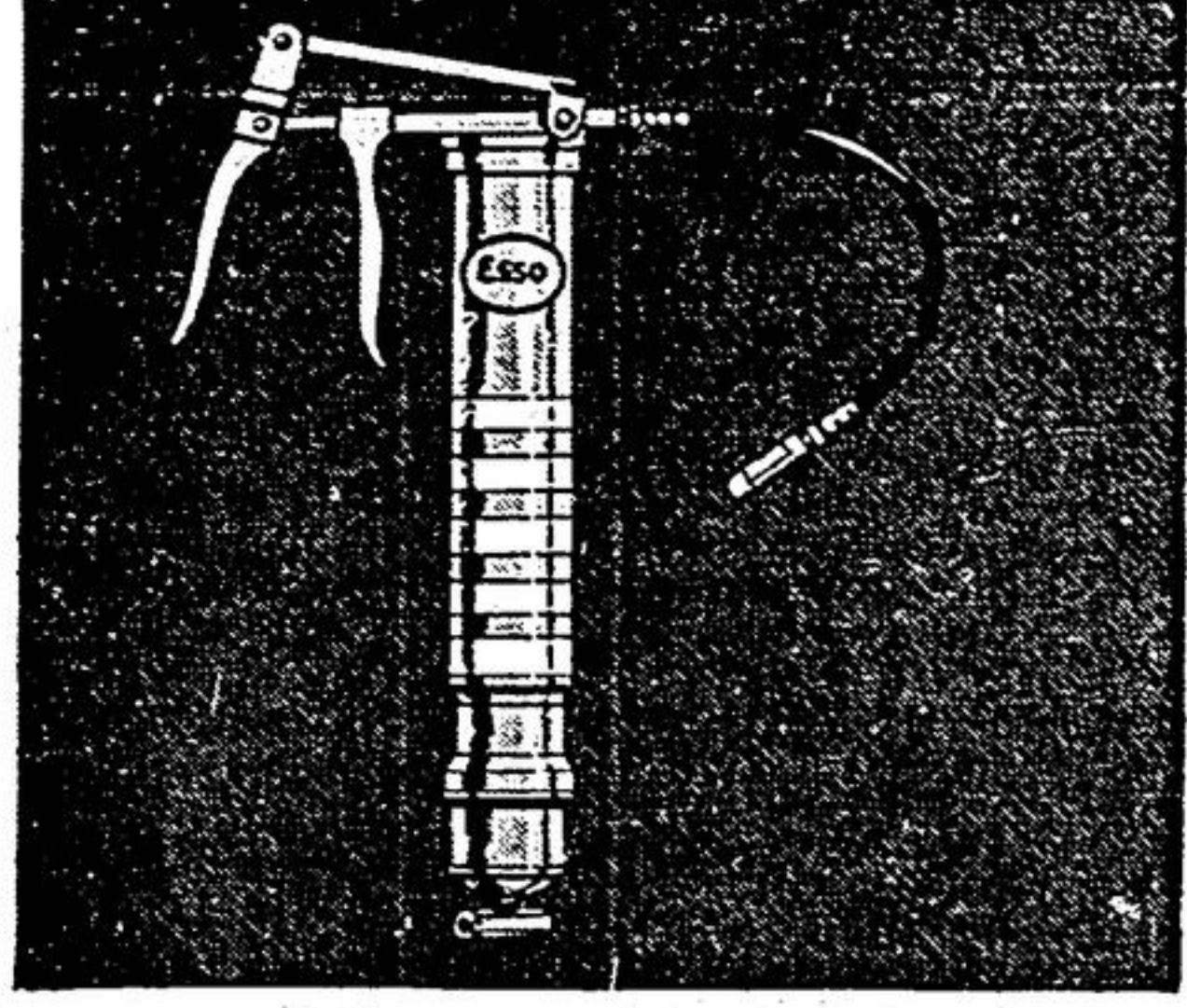
On March 23rd a capacity crowd of 200 gathered at the Compass Restaurant, Newmarket.
