York North Liberals To Name Provincial Candidate May 15th

Officials of the York North Liberal Association announced this week a provincial nomination convention will be held on Wednesday, May 15th in Aurora High School. Three candidates, two from the southern part of the county and one from the north, have already announced their intention of seeking the nomination. They include Donald Plaxton of Richmond Hill, Donald Deacon of Unionville and Mrs. Caroline Ion of Newmarket. All three candidates have had experience in municipal politics. Mr. Plaxton has served as deputy-reeve of Richmond Hill, while Donald Deacon has held the same office in Markham Township. In addition Mr. Plaxton is a former public school trustee. In 1959 he was the provincial Liberal candidate in York North. Still active in municipal life Mrs. Ion is the deputy-reeve of Newmarket, and was a candidate for the wardenship of the county last January.

Party officials hope to have Ontario Liberal leader John Wintermeyer as keynote speaker at the convention. Elected party leader in May, 1958, Mr. Wintermeyer represents Kitchener in the legislature. A member since 1955 he is a former Kitchener alderman. The last provincial member to speak at a York North rally was Elmer Sopha who represents Sudbury. Mr. Sopha was the keynote speaker at the county rally in December 1961.

York North has been represented in the legislature by Conservative Lex MacKenzie since 1945. A former member of Woodbridge Village Council Mr. MacKenzie first entered provincial politics in 1943. During the Hepburn era from 1934 to 1943 the riding was held by

Liberal Morgan Baker. A former reeve of Whitechurch Twp., Mr. Baker is now retired and living in King.

For one short period from 1943 to 1945 the riding went C.C.F. when former North York Township Reeve George Mitchell won it for that party. The 1913 provincial election saw the C.C.F. come very close to winning the government. The Tories under the leadership of George Drew formed a minority government that year and have been in power ever since. In the 1945 provincial election C.C.F. strength dropped and the Liberals once again became the official opposition.

York North has not had a provincial returning officer since the death last January of Arthur Wells of Maple following an automobile accident. Provincial Returning Officer Roderick Lewis has stated no new appointment will be made until the date of the next provincial election is announced.

The present Conservative administration was elected in June, 1959. Premier John Roberts who took over as leader from Leslie Frost in October, 1961, can continue in office until June of next year. However, he is expected to call a general election sometime this fall.

START YOUR ANNUALS DURING EARLY SPRING

Annuals fall naturally into two groups, hardy annuals and half-hardy annuals. The hardy annuals are grown from seed sown out of doors. Half-hardy annuals are sown indoors in early spring and are transplanted outdoors when danger of frost is past. Some, such as marigolds and zinnias are frost tender, while others such as petunias and verbenas must be started indoors to give them the required length of growing season for bloom production.

The majority of half-hardy annuals may be sown from now onwards except the fast growers such as zinnias and cosmos, which should be sown in late April or even early May. Sow different kinds in separate containers to make transplanting easy and efficient. Containers may be 6" seed pans or 5" pots. The soil mixture should contain 7 parts loam, 3 parts peat and 2 parts sand, add about 2 oz. of superphosphate, or a complete fertilizer, such as 5-10-15 to each bushel of mixture. If possible sift the mixture through a ¼ inch sieve, particularly for fine seeds.

Sow the seed and cover lightly with the soil mixture. Water with a fine spray to avoid uncovering the seeds. They may also be watered by placing the pot two thirds of its depth in water until the soil surface darkens, then remove to allow to drain. To prevent evaporation cover the container with glass or plastic and shade from the sun. However, to provide enough light for good seedling growth remove the shading and covers when the first seedlings appear.

Transplant the seedlings into flats when they have formed their first true leaves. Use the same soil mixture as mentioned above and space the transplants about 2 inches apart. Plenty of light is needed to keep seedlings short and sturdy. The soil should neither be saturated nor allowed to dry out, but keep in an evenly moist condition. Water early in the day so that foliage is dry before night-fall.

Annuals should not be planted out until the danger of frost is past. It is a good idea to set the flats of seedlings outside a week or more before planting out to acclimatize them gradually to outdoor conditions. Cover at night with burlap if frost threatens.

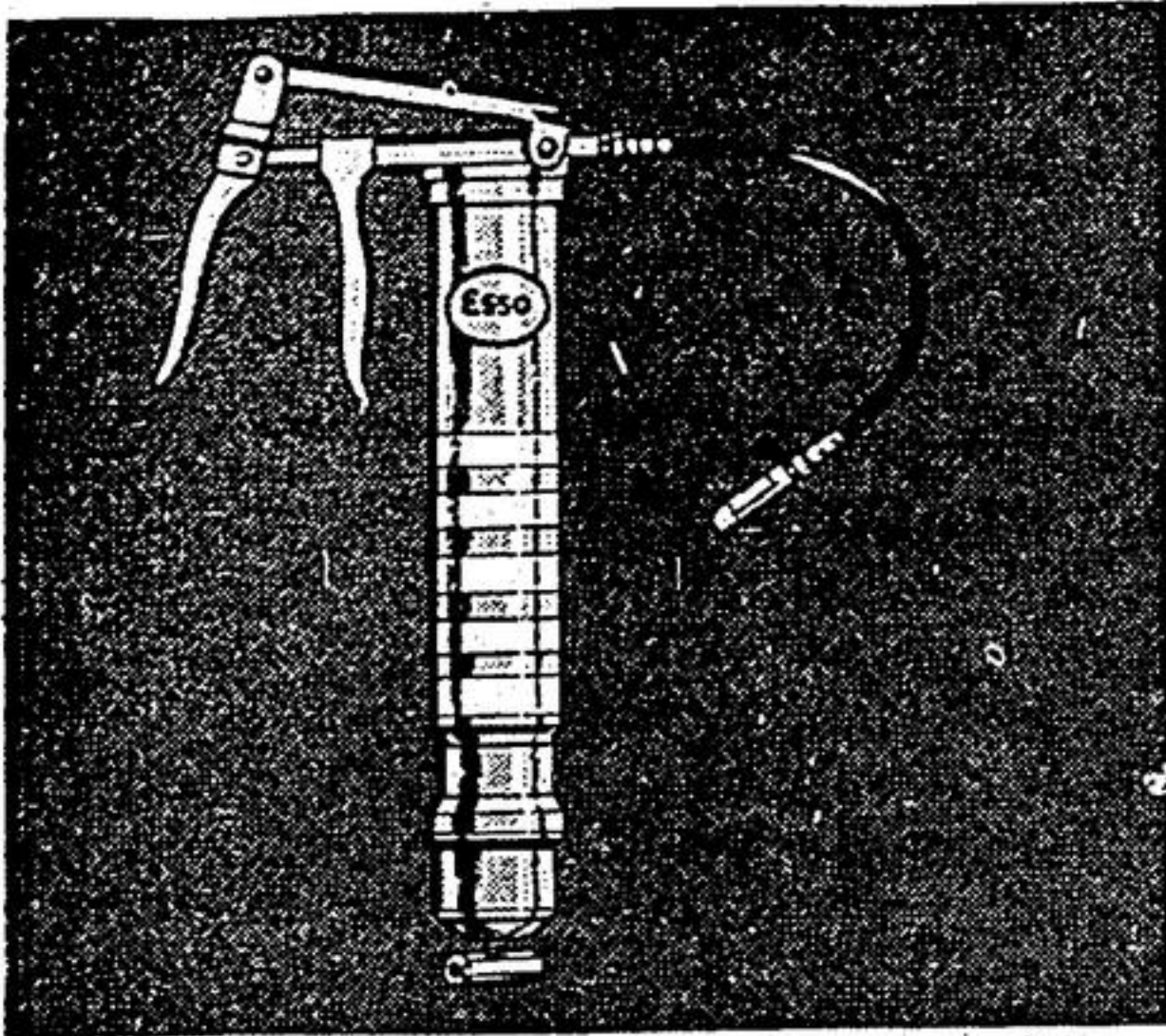
Mr. Roger Moyer, the director, came to M.V.B.C. in the fall of 1959 from Chicago

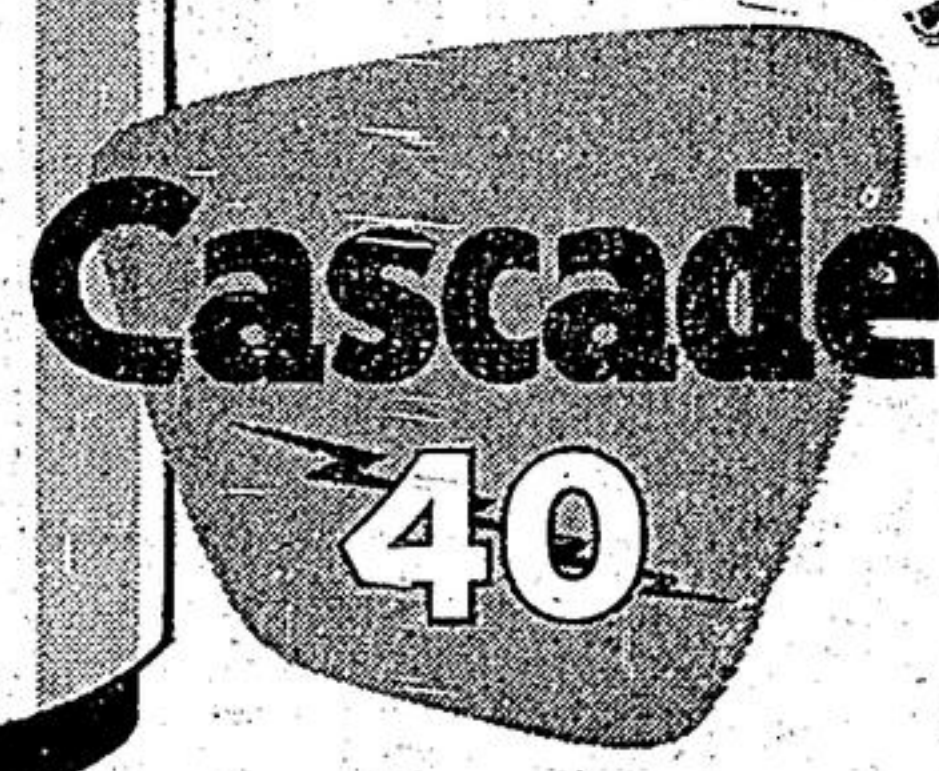
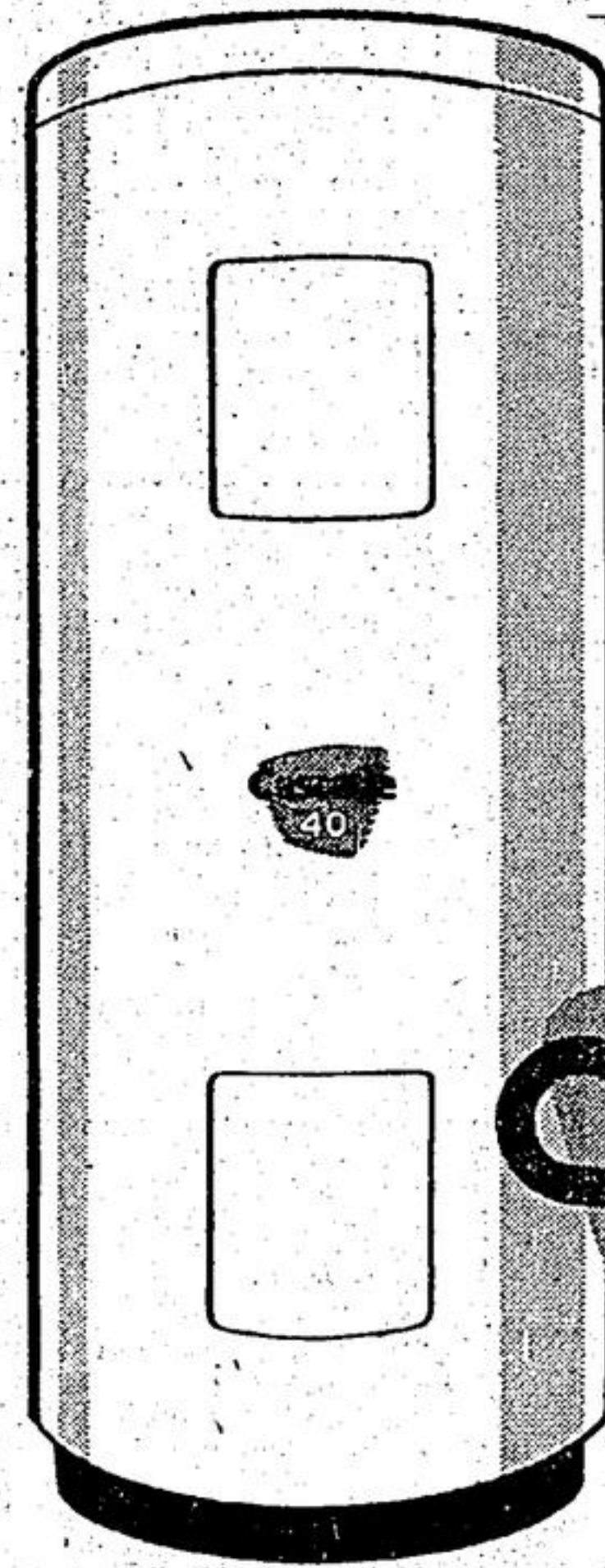
