



#### FARM REPORT

(A. A. Wall, Agricultural Representative, York County.) There is lots of interest these days in new pasture methods. Zero grazing, strip grazing, dry lot feeding and irrigation are all in the news. This is a good trend, because in a livestock county like York, hay and pasture are the key crops. Well handled, they influence success more than any other single

A dairyman who does not use one of the pasture methods is behind times. With our high land prices, and high production costs, natural grazing isn't good enough.

Natural grazing doesn't give pasture a chance to produce its best. Plants need some resting during the season, and too often costly pasture shortages occur for several weeks in mid

There are different opinions Also at this session of Parli- on which is the pasturing sysalso the most expensive. I think that on average York County farms we can do the best job with a real good strip grazing system. Strip grazing is where an electric fence is moved every day to provide

fresh pasture. This system increases production by 15 to 20 percent and the cost is quite the bottom of the pan, Home

Taking costs into account, stitute, Guelph, suggest that fitable system with herds of about 35 cows. With larger grazing and feeding from the silo all summer, paid off better.

None of these systems will work unless there is a good crop of pasture to begin with. Forage harvesters and electric fences will not compensate for poor mixtures, badly managed. Getting and maintaining a good stand is the first and most important step. Good legume balance, fertility, weed control, clipping and harrowing, will give a good volume to start with. The decision can then be made whether to harvest it with cows or with a forage harvester. On most of our farms, I think it is still sound to let the cows do the chopping.
