

Sunday School Lesson

Golden Text: The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament sheweth his handywork. - Psa. 19:1. Approach to the Lesson .

God, says David in the Nineteenth Psalm, is speaking to us in two ways or through two media. There is on the one hand the glory of nature and, on the other, the wonder of the Word. They constitute two books by the same author and carry the same basic message. The Roman letter brings home to us a similar thought, "It is not that they (men) do not know the truth about God: indeed he has made it quite plain to them. For since the beginning of the world the invisible attributes of God, for example, his eternal power and divinity, have been plainly discernible through things which he has made and which are commonly seen and known, thus leaving these men without a rag of excuse."

God speaks to us through the world and through the Word; we therefore listen for His voice in the countryside as well as in the church, and expect to see the same footprint in nature as we do in the Bible. "Man may ... receive knowledge of God ... from the visible cosmos ... and by instruction through ... the Law. They are respectively the material and moral realms, one infinite and impressive in grandeur, the other inward and direct in operation. Without the physical light of the sun and the spiritual light of the divine commandments, all life would fail."


