## Markham Twp. Police Have Busy Month

Markham Twp. police recorded their busiest month in the history of the department when they responded to 964 calls in June. The report was presented to the Council on Monday night by Police Chief, Harvey Cox. During this thirty-day period, their cruisers travelled 11,779 miles. Officers investigated 24 accidents; 15 dog complaints; made 16 liquor seizures; answered 15 fire calls; had 11 break, entries and thefts and 6 instances of malicious damage. Seven persons were charged in the break and entries and four were charged with theft. Sign at Corner Township Engineer "Dusty" Mikales informed the Council that he had already contacted Mr. Ruddy of the Toronto and York Road's Commission concerning the erection of a check-board sign at the intersection of 16th Ave. and Don Mills Rd. near Buttonville. The corner was the scene of a serious accident recently when a truck driver failed to see the corner and rammed into the ditch on the west side of the pavement. Four persons were admitted to hospital after the crash.
