Open Season Hunting Dates Announced

Open seasons for fox, rabbit, raccoon and squirrel have been announced by Lands and Forests Minister, the Hon. A. Kelso Roberts.

Seasons for the Lake Simcoe Forest District are as follows:

FOX—These animals may be hunted or trapped under a licence, and the pelts thereof may be possessed in any part of Ontario from the 1st day of September, 1963 to the 30th day of September, 1964, inc.

RABBITS—These animals may be hunted or trapped under a licence, from Oct. 16, 1963, to February 29, 1964, inclusive, in the Counties of Dufferin, York, Peel, South Simcoe and in the townships of south Brock in Ontario County, North Simcoe (north of No. 90 hwy.) and North Reach and Scott Townships in Ontario County the season is open from September 2, 1963 to March 31, 1964, inc.

In the Townships of Wood and Baxter, the season is from September 2, 1963 to August 31, 1964 incl. **NO PERSON SHALL HUNT** more than 6 cottontail rabbits per day.

RACCOON—May be hunted or trapped under a licence and the pelts possessed in any part of the province from the 1st day of September 1963 to the 30th day of September, 1964, both days inclusive.

SQUIRREL—May be hunted or trapped in Dufferin County from October 5th to December 14th inclusive, and in the remainder of the District from September 21st to December 14th, inclusive. **POSSESSION LIMIT**—not more than ten at one time.
