

# CLAREMONT PITCHER BELTS HOME RUN IN 9th INNING OF TOURNAMENT FINAL

## Wes Evans Drives In Winner

The Claremont softball club left their home park, \$40 richer on Saturday afternoon, following one of the most hair-raising rallies ever staged on that diamond. It was a story that could have been clipped from an Ozark like comic strip. The setting was the final game in an eight-team tournament, Greenwood Srs. held a 1-0 lead in the bottom of the 9th inning with two out. Claremont pitcher, Jim Redshaw was due at bat after two previous innings were routine outs. His mound rival, Grant Pascoe fired a fastball across the heart of the plate to end the anguish and with one mighty swing, the 17 year old eighth grader poked the ball into deep left-centrefield. Romping around the bases like a runaway race horse, the young athlete slid across the plate in a cloud of dirt, dust and gravel. With the score deadlocked at 1-1, a walk, an error and a hit by Gord McDowell loaded up the sacks. Wes Evans then came through with a timely single and Claremont were the victors as McDowell scored easily with the winner.

## Markham "Aces" Oust Newmarket From OASA Playoffs; Now Meet Aurora

Markham "Aces" ousted Newmarket from the OASA playoffs on Tuesday night with a 7-3 win at Newmarket. They won the first game of the best of three series last Wednesday by a score of 11-0, and will now go against Aurora Glenviewers. Aurora competed in the North York League this season and won the league title.

Norm Roberts is Aurora's pitcher. Norm Studden, well known in local sports circles, can also handle the mound duties. Ted Matthews will likely start for the "Aces."

The first game of this series will be played at the Aurora Park on Saturday night with the return contest next Tuesday at Markham. If a third game is necessary it will be played next Thursday on a neutral diamond.

Ellis Fans Eighteen "Lefty" Bob Ellis was in top form for the first game against Newmarket last Wednesday night as he chalked up eighteen strikeouts and gave up only four hits as Markham won 11-0.

Bill Bowen was the losing pitcher. He spread eleven strikeouts over the eight inning contest but was belted for fifteen hits.

First baseman Bernie McGriskin led Markham in the batting department, clouting two singles and a double to drive in three runs and score

two himself. Rich Conlin, Bill and Jim Johnson each hit a single and a double. Jackie Robinson collected two safeties.

John McGuire had two of Newmarket's four hits. One was a single and the other a double.

Newmarket committed four errors while Markham made one. The "Aces" left eight men on base while the losers stranded five.

Mathews Relieves Dyke With the "Aces" down 3-0 in the second inning of the return game Ted Matthews came on in relief of starter Fred Dyke and hurled no-hit ball for the remainder of the game. Dyke was clipped for four hits and had three runs scored against him. Matthews struck out ten batters and walked three in seven innings.

Bob Atwell started for Newmarket but was replaced in the seventh frame by Bill Bowen. Markham collected eleven hits off the two hurlers.

Jackie Robinson was a big man at the plate for the winners. He whacked a single, a double, and a triple. Left-fielder Rod MacArthur belted a home-run for the "Aces."

Catcher Mike Higgins played a good game for Markham. He made a fine play in the fifth inning when he threw to second to catch a runner attempting to steal.
