Bus No. 1 starts at 17th Ave. and Don Mills Rd. at 7:45 a.m. and proceeds north to pick up Grades 6, 7, and 8 and auxiliary pupils across the town-line to S.S. 4, Markham on the 3rd Con. He then picks up on Bayview starting at 18th Ave. at 8:20 a.m., proceeds south to 3rd Con. and meets No. 2 bus at 16th Ave. and 3rd Con. at 8:30 a.m., takes all grades and proceeds up the 3rd Con. to S.S. No. 4 north on the 3rd Con. to the town-line east on the town-line to Old Gormley and down Don Mills to No. 7 School.

Bus No. 2 starts at 17th Ave. and Don Mills Rd. at 8 a.m., proceeds south picking up all grades to Buttonville school, south to John St. and then retraces up Don Mills to No. 7 highway, west on No. 7 Hwy. to the 3rd Con. This bus meets bus no. 1 at 16th Ave. and 3rd Con. at 8:30 a.m. and then returns to Buttonville.

The Bus No. 3 for grades 1 to 5 at No. 7 school will start at 17th Ave. and Don Mills at 8:40 a.m. and proceed to No. 7 school.

A bus will leave Victoria Sq. at 8:10 a.m., proceed west on 18th to Yonge St. and north on Yonge St. to town-line, retrace on Yonge St. to 19th, and east on 19th to Bayview, south on Bayview to 18th, across 18th to 3rd Con. and up to No. 4 school.

Please Note: (1) All parents are to send the slip received in the mail with their child on the first day of school to show the bus driver. (2) All schools will be dismissed at 3:30 p.m. (3) For Grades 6, 7, and 8, the children will take bus No. 1 at 8:30 a.m. Grades 6, 7 and 8 and auxiliary pupils will take bus No. 1 about 7:55 a.m.

## Markham P. S. Area No. 3 School Bus Schedule

The trustees of Markham Township Public School Area No. 3 have worked out a student bus pick-up schedule to commence with the opening of the September term and parents and pupils are urged to take special notice of this new arrangement. The schedule is as follows:

### LEMONTVILLE

No. 4 School Bus # 1 Start at 17th Avenue and Don Mills for grades 6, 7, 8, and auxiliary class at 7:45 a.m., proceeds northward to Gormley town-line across the town-line and down to #4 school.

No. 7 School Bus # 2 Start at 17th Avenue and Don Mills Rd. at 8:40 a.m. and go north on Don Mills Rd. to #7 school for grades 1 to 5 inclusive.

No. 7 School for Gormley pupils Bus #1 leaves #4 school at 8:45 a.m. and proceeds north to town-line to Gormley and down Don Mills to #7 school.

No. 5 School Bus # 2 Start at 17th Avenue and Don Mills Rd. at 8 a.m. and proceed south to #5 school for all grades 1 to 8 and auxiliary pupils and let off pupils in grades 1 to 5 inclusive at #5 school, then proceed to pick balance of pupils, (all grades) who go to #5 and #4 schools.

Go down to Yonge St. and turn around and return to #7 Hwy. and proceed west to 3rd. conc. turns north on 3rd. conc. and meets bus #1 at 3rd conc. and 16th Avenue and returns to #5 school.

Bus #3 Leaves Victoria Square at 8:10 a.m. proceeds west on 18 Ave. to Yonge St. turns north at Yonge St. proceeds to the Gormley town-line and picks up all grades and returns to 19th Ave. proceeds east to Bayview down Bayview to 18th Ave. and returns to #4 school.

Please note that all schools will be dismissed at 3:30 p.m.
