Air Show at Buttonville Airport This Saturday

A spectacular air show featuring 20 flying acts and over 200 aeroplanes including the cream of the crop of executive and recreational planes in various demonstrations and static displays will take place at Buttonville airport on Saturday, September 14th at 1:30 p.m.

The big show will mark the official opening by Toronto Airways Limited of their new modern facilities at this rapidly expanding airport. The airport which is located 1 mile north of #7 highway on Don Mills Road will feature the fabulous Jocelyn Flying Circus, Air Force aerobatics, sky diving, helicopters, air sea rescue aircraft, gliders, water bombing as well as various interesting static displays. It will be a fast moving program geared to provide a breath-taking afternoon's entertainment. The Jocelyn Air Circus will feature such acts as dual and formation aerobatics, daring parachute jumps, a comedy act, as well as dead engine aero-

batics. An interesting display of water bombing in which a PBY aircraft will drop 8 tons of water from an altitude of 400 feet should prove interesting. Spectacular three man parachute drops from 9500 feet will undoubtedly be a feature of the program which will be rounded out by flights of radio-controlled model aeroplanes and various other crowd-pleasing events.

The proprietors of the Toronto Airways Limited, Messrs. Charles Dunn, Michael C. Sifton and Joseph Gerace have taken great care to provide all the needed facilities to stage this event including ample parking for cars, food concessions, as well as a staff of several hundred men and air cadets who will direct the 25,000 people who are expected to turn out to this official opening of their new airport. In case of inclement weather the air show will be postponed until Sunday afternoon at the same time.

Many Varieties Apples For Various Uses

Apple time is here in Ontario. With it, often comes confusion about what kind of apples to buy for a particular purpose. Here are brief sketches on five popular kinds of Ontario grown apples.

DELICIOUS: This apple is medium to large in size and has a deep red colored skin. It can be distinguished by a ring of bumps around the blossom end of the fruit. Delicious apples are rated 'excellent' for eating and salads and 'fair' for sauce and baking.

RHODE ISLAND GREENING: These apples can be easily identified by their green or yellowish skins. Rhode Island Greening apples are rated 'good' for baking and sauce and 'fair' for eating and salads.

CORTLAND: These apples are large and predominantly red in color. They are rated 'excellent' for sauce and 'good' for eating, baking, salads and pies. **MCINTOSH:** These apples are medium to large in size and a bright red in color. The red background color is striped with carmine. Some very highly colored fruit is almost purplish in color. McIntosh apples are rated 'excellent' for eating and 'good' for baking, sauce and salads.

NORTHERN SPY: The aver-

age Northern Spy is larger in size than the average of the other kinds of apples mentioned here. The pale yellow skins of the apples are nearly concealed by pinkish-red stripes. Northern Spy apples are rated 'excellent' for pies and sauce, and 'good' for eating, baking and salads.

Food experts at Macdonald Institute, Guelph suggest that you try the various kinds of apples and then, when you have determined your favorites you can confidently buy them in quantity.
