**Hebrew Christian Church Founder To Speak At Vivian**

Dr. A. U. Michelson, founder and minister of the First Hebrew Christian Church of Los Angeles, and well known for his nation wide broadcasts of the HEBREW CHRISTIAN HOUR heard throughout the United States and Canada, will be in McCormack Memorial Church in Vivian, on Sunday, November 17, at 7:30 p.m.

Dr. Michelson has made several extensive tours of Palestine and the New State of Israel, and many countries in Europe and recently returned. He brings first-hand account of the conditions in that part of the world. He will tell of the development in Palestine and the unique position of the Jews today in relation to the present world crisis.

Formerly a judge and attorney in Germany, Dr. Michelson was reared in Orthodox Jewry, but later embraced Christianity. He will also tell his life story, a heart gripping tale of how he went through great spiritual struggle before he accepted the Christian faith.

Dr. Michelson is director of the world-wide missionary enterprise with representatives in Israel, Algiers, Morocco, South America, England, France, Germany, Australia and elsewhere. His dramatic presentation of candid eye-witness accounts of world conditions and his fervent evangelistic eloquence has drawn large numbers to hear him in many parts of the world. The meetings are open to the public, and it is suggested to come early to get a good seat.

**Form Water Service To Offset Shortage**

All resources of the Agricultural Representative service and the Agricultural Engineering service of the Ontario Department of Agriculture have been called into play by the Emergency Water Committee which was appointed by Agriculture Minister William A. Stewart.

Following a meeting of the Committee Monday, K.E. Lantz, chairman stated that all agricultural representatives in the province have been contacted and will act as local clearing houses for water supply problems. The engineering service will also be available to give assistance in providing the storage of water on farms on which the water supply has been depleted, and to assist in developing sources of supply.

The co-operation of corporations or individuals who have trucks and tanks suitable for the hauling of water would be appreciated by the committee. They have been requested to contact the local Agricultural Representative in their area if they have suitable equipment. Municipalities or individuals who have sources of supply are also asked to contact the Agricultural Representatives.

"We are calling on the resources of all Agricultural Representatives and Agricultural Engineers to meet this emergency," said Mr. Lantz.

The Committee also completed arrangement with the Ontario Department of Health to prepare instructions for the treatment of water. The recommendations will be sent to the local Medical Health Officer.

"One of the chief concerns of the Committee is the matter of public health," said Mr. Lantz. "It is an extremely important factor which has to be considered. Information will be available through the Agricultural Representatives."

From a health standpoint particular emphasis will be placed on the method of transportation, the source of water, and the method of storage. Mr. Lantz said that the Agricultural Representatives would keep the Committee informed of conditions in their areas on a daily basis, in order that the most severely stricken areas of the province might receive priority.
