### Bloomington Owner Awarded \$500 For Corner Settlement

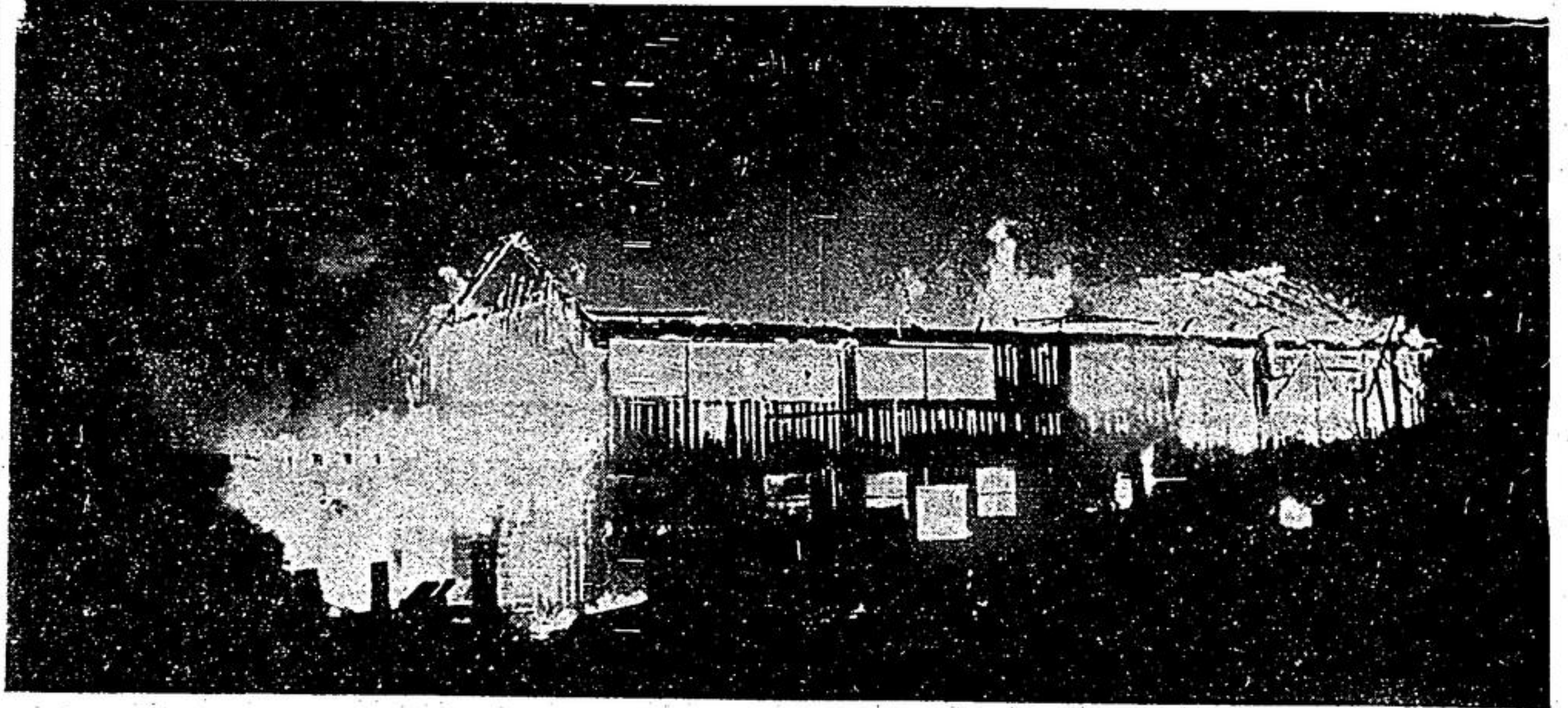
