Starter, Chuck Routledge yielded 9 goals but the homesters pelted his cage with 57 shots. He held the fort against Barry McLean on two clean-cut breakaways. McLean fired three of his team's 11-goal production. Ross Brown potted a pair. Glenn Hooper netted two and singles came from the sticks of Jim Hood, Stan Feasby, Bob Mustard and Rod Kelson. Bill Corner collected 3 assists. Mel Townley and Doug Woods blinked the light for Orangeville.

Stouffville move back to Orangeville for a Boxing Day match on Dec. 26th and then play at Port Perry on Dec. 30th. Their next home contest is against Uxbridge on the afternoon of New Year's Day at 2:30.
