In November, Robert H. McGillivray, son of John H. and the late Florence McGillivray graduated from the University of Toronto with the degree of Doctor of Education. Bob is at present principal of Earlscourt Public School in Toronto and resides with his wife, Lorraine, and three children, Dan, Karen and Mark in suburban East York.



Bob completed his elementary schooling at S.S. No. 9, Uxbridge where he came under the inspiring teaching of Miss Alma Ward (Mrs. Howard

(Haynes). He attended "fifth class" at Goodwood School and secondary school at Uxbridge High. He graduated from Toronto Normal School and began his teaching career at S.S. No. 8, East Gwillimbury. After two years in the RCAF, Bob returned to teach for a year at Goodwood School along with Mrs. Norman Wagg. The remainder of his teaching career has been in various Toronto schools. Next September he is to become principal of the new Christie Street School which is to be the most modern and largest junior school in Toronto.

While his teaching career progressed Bob continued his studies at the University of Toronto from which he won a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1948 and a Bachelor of Pedagogy degree in 1952. In the meantime he was granted a high school Teacher's certificate and a public school Inspector's certificate from the Ontario Department of Education.

Bob's thesis for his doctorate was entitled, "Differences in Home Background Between High-achieving and Low-achieving Gifted Children." The four hundred page dissertation contains the following dedication, "Dedicated to the memory of my mother, Florence Alena Brown McGillivray, whose sense of responsibility, sense of humour, great patience and keen mind are an inspiration to me always."

The 1963 Council of the Twp. of Pickering refused to take any positive action on the purchase of a new gravel pit near Clarendon when the members met for their year-end session on Monday night.

Mr. Harold Elliott, solicitor for Pickering has suggested that the Ontario Municipal Act does not permit one township to complete such a purchase within the boundaries of another municipality.

The Dept. of Highways, on the other hand, has given its approval of the contract and will pay the regular subsidy.

Councillor Milton Mowbray contended that enough doubt had been cast on the legitimacy of the transaction that would

make it advisable to delay action on the move. "It is not up to the Dept. of Hwys. to appreciate the meaning of the Municipal Act," he said.

The proposed gravel pit site is located about two miles north-east of Claremont.
