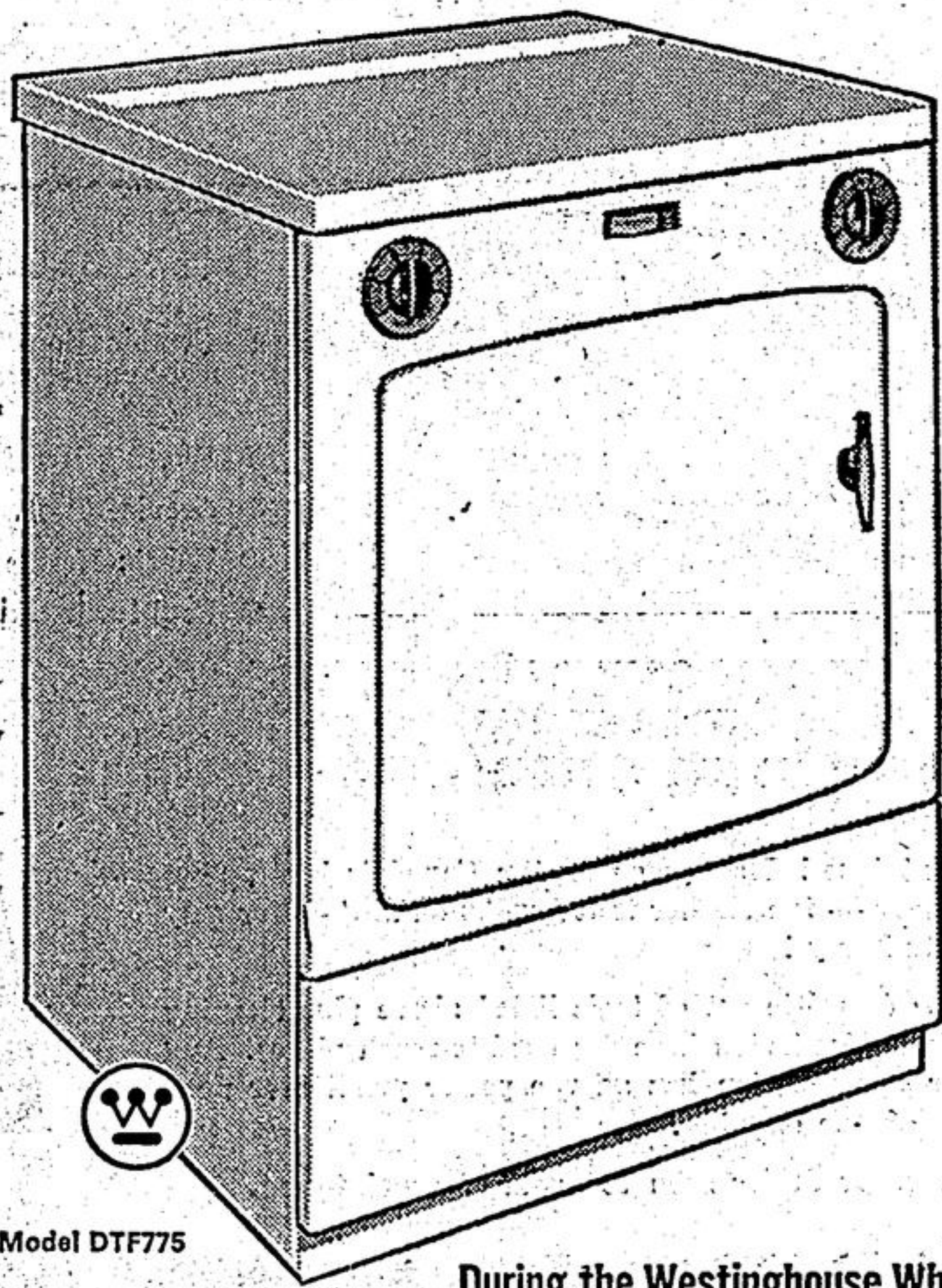

York County Council will have few new faces in 1964. There will be seven changes to be exact, among the 28 representatives. This is one of the largest holdovers ever recorded. The 1963 Warden, Clarence Davis of Aurora will hold office until late this month when a new Warden and two new commissioners will be elected.

Reeve Albert Rutherford of Vaughan Township is the most likely choice for the 1964 Wardenship. He was last year's chairman of finance. Two members who will be seeking the office of Commissioner will be Reeve Sid Legge of Newmarket and Reeve Win Timbers of Stouffville.
