Brown's Corners Church Reduces Debt \$5700

In 1963, Brown's Corners United Church completed its most successful year with six active youth groups for boys, girls and young people, two groups of United Church Women, four catering groups, a junior and senior choir, a Bible study group and active stewards and elders. A large Vacation Church School was held in co-operation with Victoria Square and Headford. More than \$17,000 was raised from all sources by a total membership of 86 families of 201, (32 non-resident). Of this amount, \$11,895.34 was for church purposes, the building fund and the Toronto and Home Missions extension. The building debt was reduced by \$5,700 during the year, to \$15,000 on Dec. 31, 1963. M. and M. funds were \$1,805.86.

Gideons Dedicate New Headquarters

The Gideons International in Canada dedicated their new national headquarters at Leaside in Metro Toronto at a special ceremony on Saturday. The building which will serve as the base for Canadian operations is being financed apart from donations by friends. More than a quarter of a million Bibles and Testaments are distributed annually by Canadian Gideons. There are 2,000 Gideons in Canada organized into 166 local organizations called camps.

Major areas of distribution include hotels, motels, hospitals, prisons, schools and personal copies of the New Testament with Psalms and Proverbs to grade five school children and to nurses.
