



Your government is issuing Social Insurance Number Cards in place of the unemployment insurance numbers that most employed people have had until now. The new numbers will help government to use modern office methods for greater efficiency in handling unemployment insurance, and also other social benefits such as proposed pension plans.

For these reasons, you are invited to apply for a Social Insurance Number, even if you are not a

contributor to the unemployment insurance plan. If you haven't yet applied, here's what you do.

IF YOU ARE AN EMPLOYEE your employer will give you an application form. Fill it out and return to your employer promptly. IF YOU ARE UNEMPLOYED and drawing benefit you will complete an application form when you report

to the Unemployment Insurance Commission in person or by mail. IF YOU ARE AN EMPLOYER registered with the Commission, you will receive application forms automatically. If NOT registered with the Commission, please get in touch with your local U.I.C. office and application forms will be sent to you. Distribute
