**Lay Charges Against  
 29 Hut Owners**  
 Harold Van Wyck of the Orilla  
 branch of the department of  
 lands and forests has reported  
 that fish hut owners are to be  
 charged for leaving their huts  
 on Lake Simcoe beyond the legal  
 deadline.  
 Final date for removal was  
 March 31 and although Lake  
 Couchiching was clear by then,  
 numerous huts still dotted Lake  
 Simcoe. Department officers  
 flew over Simcoe on the week-  
 end making a final check be-  
 fore laying charges.  
 Investigation showed 29 huts  
 still littered the ice so names  
 and addresses were noted by  
 conservation officers. Mr. Van  
 Wyck said charges will be laid  
 in all 29 instances.  
 The charge carries with a  
 maximum fine of \$1,000.

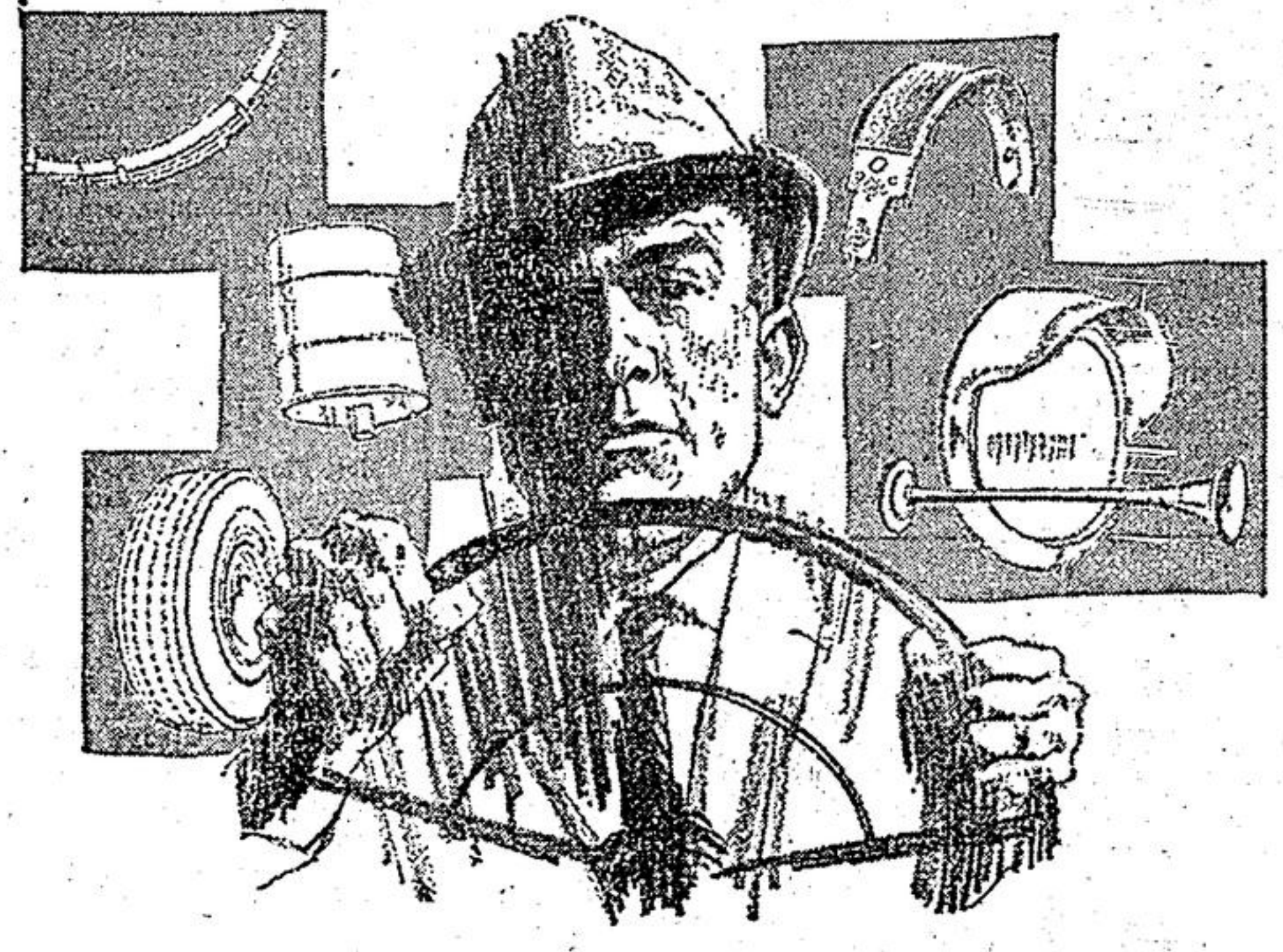

**Have you applied for your Social Insurance Number?**  
 Your government is issuing Social Insurance Number Cards in place of the unemployment insurance numbers that most employed people have had until now. The new numbers will help government to use modern office methods for greater efficiency in handling unemployment insurance, and also other social benefits such as proposed pension plans.  
 For these reasons, you are invited to apply for a Social Insurance Number, even if you are not a contributor to the unemployment insurance plan.  
 If you haven't yet applied, here's what you do.  
**IF YOU ARE AN EMPLOYEE** your employer will give you an application form. Fill it out and return to your employer promptly.  
**IF YOU ARE UNEMPLOYED** and drawing benefit you will complete an application form when you report to the Unemployment Insurance Commission in person or by mail.  
**IF YOU ARE AN EMPLOYER** registered with the Commission, you will receive application forms automatically. If NOT registered with the Commission, please get in touch with your local U.I.C. office and application forms will be sent to you. Distribute application forms to your employees, have them completed and return them together, not individually, to the Commission.
