Your M.P. Reports

The Government introduced another Supply Motion for the purpose of putting forward for discussion in the House the Estimates of a number of government departments.
(The Official Opposition, as is normal, introduced a Motion of Non-confidence, based on government policies with regard to eastern agriculture. The debate was led off by the former Minister of Agriculture, who charged that the Canadian flag issue was being brought up to cover up a whole series of sins of omission, including the agricultural question.)
There are, all told, six Supply Motions during a Session of Parliament and, as has been the practice and tradition of the past, the Opposition has an opportunity to express non-confidence in the Government on any subject they may choose.

Because of the three splinter parties in the Opposition, if the Official Opposition fails to provide such motions of non-confidence, then it is more than likely that one of the other groups would do so.

Quite recently I received a copy of a letter signed by the Postmaster General to the Bay Ridges Ratepayers' Association, advising them that the Post Office Department is planning for the provision of letter carrier service to a large section of Pickering Township.

He stated that he was now prepared to recommend to the Treasury Board that letter carrier service be provided from the Ajax Post Office to Pickering Village, Bay Ridges, Fairport Beach and Ajax.

Since this announcement was made, Pickering Village has decided that they would rather retain their Post Office, and asked to be excluded from letter carrier service.

Following this, I have had representations made for the inclusion of the Pickering Beach area and the Frenchman's Bay area in the letter carrier service. Upon communication with the Postmaster General, he has now advised me that consideration is being given to include both these areas, and I am hoping that Treasury Board will approve this submission by the Postmaster General and that the whole general area, without including some 500 calls in Pickering Village, will be receiving letter carrier service in

the not too distant future.
A tremendous number of visitors are now coming to Ottawa. This commenced at the time when the tulips were in full bloom, and is continuing each and every day. Bus loads of tourists, as well as students from various schools, are present in the House of Commons and the Parliament Buildings.

Richmond Hill ROA Leads In Equipment Installed on Area Farms

Ontario Hydro's Central Region farm customers are leading the province in the amount of modern labor-saving, electrical equipment being used on their farms.

Electrical energy consumed on farms in this Region is more than 10,000 kilowatt hours a year on the average. This is much higher than in other Regions of the province.

One of the sectors where the greatest increase in use of electrical equipment is taking place in this Region is Richmond Hill Rural Operating Area. In the past two months there has been much new equipment introduced such as brooder installations, stable cleaners, feed handling equipment, etc., that would use some 208,150 kilowatt hours of additional electricity annually.

Additional Hired Hands
New electrically-operated farm equipment not only is taking most of the back-breaking drudgery out of farming, but also is speeding up chores and is equivalent to the farmer having several additional hired hands.

To increase the effectiveness of the contact with the farmers by Rural Operating Area farm representatives and to determine the amount of labor-saving electrical equipment installed as a result of these contacts and demonstrations, a record is kept in Hydro's Central Region office covering the activities throughout the entire region. The Rural Operating Area where farm representatives achieve the best results in aiding farmers to "farm better electrically" in a two-month period is determined, and recognition is given with the awarding of a plaque. The attractive special farm plaque was awarded to the Richmond Hill Rural Operating Area staff.

The period plaque has just been presented by Charles E. Crease, Consumer Service Engineer of Central Region to L. J. "Lorie" Roy, Manager of Ontario Hydro's Richmond Hill Rural Operating Area in connection with the outstanding performance during the past two month period of the Richmond Hill R.O.A. The presentation took place in a rural atmosphere. Members of the Richmond Hill Rural Operating Area staff visited the Oak Ridges Dairy Farm owned by Ruben Dennis. This farm is one of the outstanding examples of a modern electrically-operated dairy farm where the newest in electrical equipment has been installed. Staff members had an opportunity to inspect at first-hand some of this equipment at the Oak Ridges Dairy Farm.

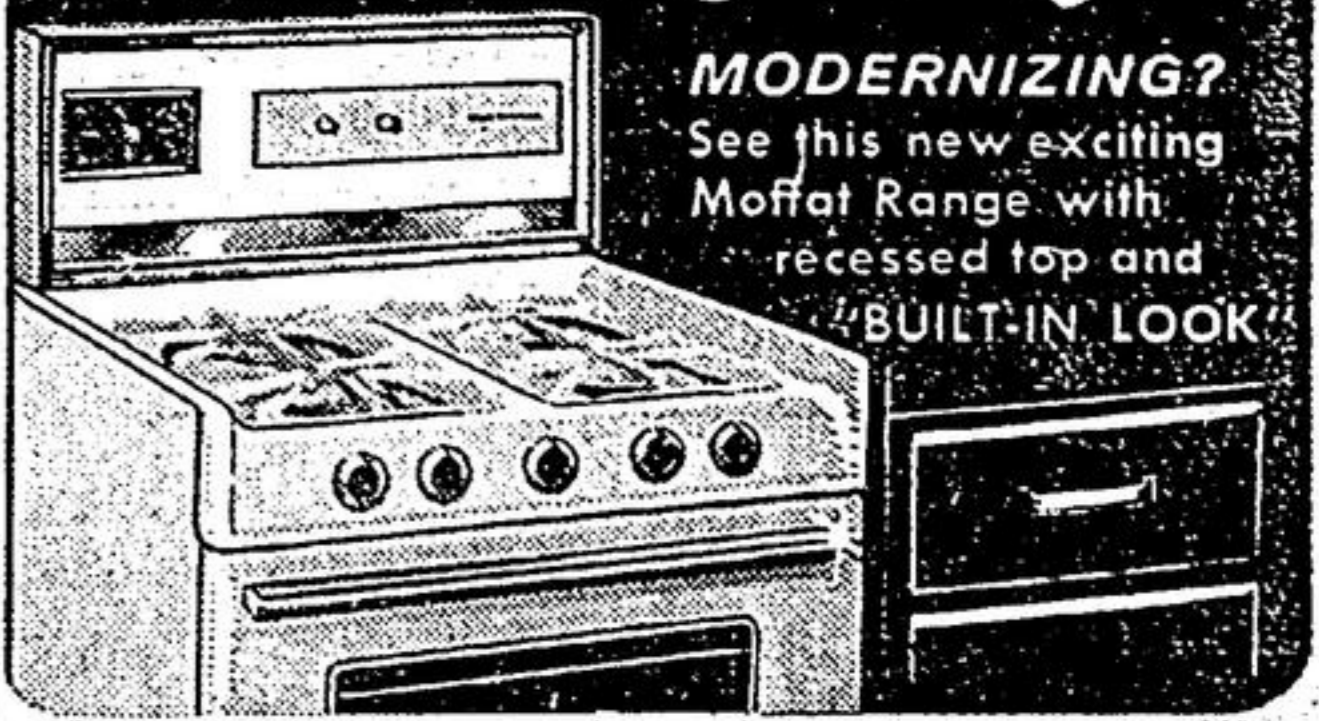
