an announcement regarding
EXTENSION OF PHYSIOTHERAPY SERVICE

On and after Monday, September 14, 1964, residents of Ontario are entitled, without charge, to medically necessary physiotherapy services received in the offices of registered physiotherapists in private practice in Ontario who participate in the extension of physiotherapy service administered by the Ontario Hospital Services Commission. The services must be prescribed by a duly qualified physician and performed by, or under the direct supervision of, a registered physiotherapist. A course of treatment may be for a maximum of three weeks unless the physician prescribes a longer period.

HOME TREATMENT

If, in the opinion of the attending physician, a patient cannot attend the physiotherapist's office, treatment in the patient's place of residence will be covered, but in such cases the physiotherapist may charge the patient, or patients, a total of \$1.00 per visit, regardless of the number of patients treated during the visit.

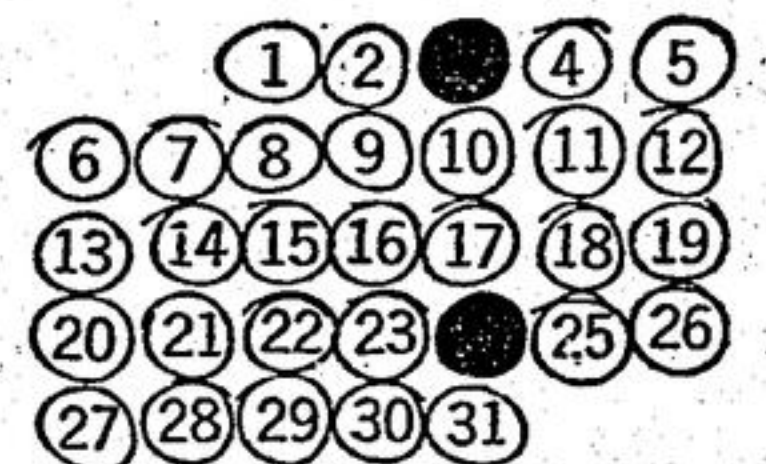
The main purpose of this additional service to patients is to make the most efficient use of available physiotherapy facilities. It is to be financed by Federal Health Grants and by the Province of Ontario.

Certain physiotherapy services are not available under this program. These services may be obtained through private arrangement with the physiotherapist.

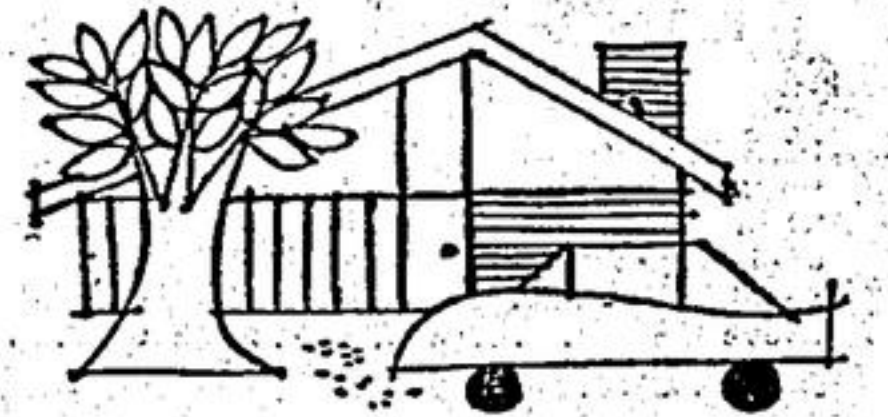

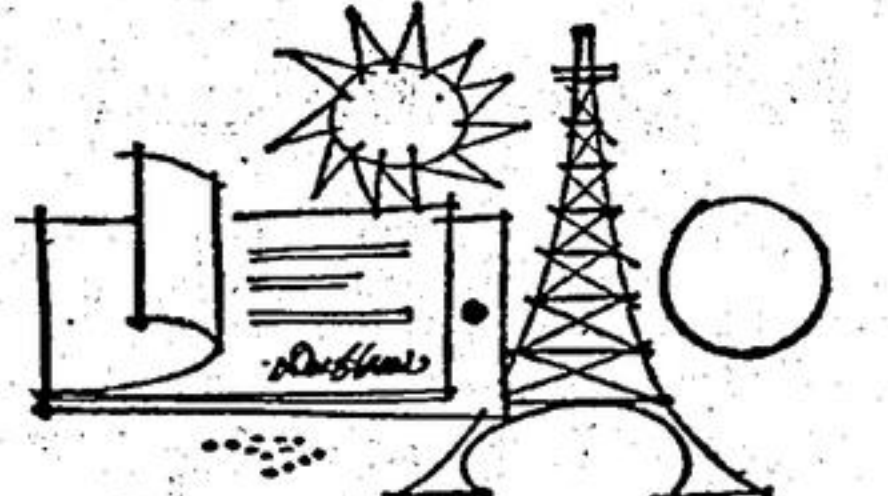

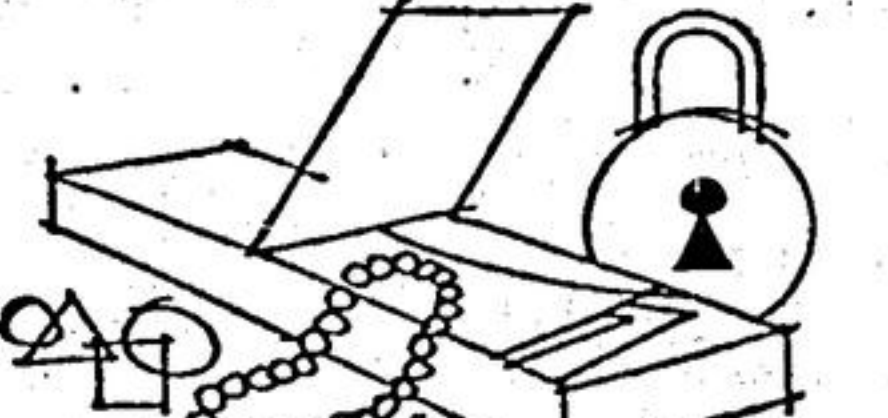
