## Proposes Sub-Div. Near Vandorf

Mr. Lawrence Hennessey appeared before Whitchurch Twp. Council on Monday night seeking consideration for a small sub-division on his land on the Don Mills Rd. near Vandorf. The actual number of lots was not stated but Mr. Hennessey said that all would have 100 ft. frontage and 250 ft. depth. He said all the homes would be served by septic tanks and suggested one deep well for the water supply.

Deputy-reeve Farquharson said that since the development would be on Mr. Hennessey's land, he would have to be responsible for any water supply arrangements. All the houses would have 1400 sq. ft. or more. Reeve Williams said he believed that the request for consideration should go to Planning Board which also meets this week. All sub-division plans in the township have to be submitted to the Minister of Planning before proceeding.
