

if you are responsible for an automobile accident after your insurance policy has lapsed?

When you allow your insurance policy to lapse you immediately become an uninsured motor vehicle owner. Before you drive, you must either pay the \$20 uninsured motor vehicle fee at a Department of Transport licence agency office or renew your insurance, or you will be liable to a fine of up to \$500.

The \$20 fee gives you NO protection whatever. If there is a claim against you as an uninsured motor vehicle owner for which you are liable, it will be paid by the Motor Vehicle Accident Claims Fund, but you must repay the fund. You will not be allowed to own or operate a motor vehicle until you make arrangements to do so.

Judgments up to \$25,000 are not uncommon. A debt of this size could seriously hamper your family's future. Protect your future. The wisest course is to buy automobile liability insurance and keep it in force. Always carry your insurance card in your automobile.
