

# Clippers Win Fifth Straight, Whip Cannington-Sutton 5-1

It looked like Tuesday night at the Fights, but once the smoke and dust had cleared, the Stouffville "Clippers" had clipped the Sutton-Cannington "Twins" 5-1. It was the Clippers fifth win in as many starts.

A total of 26 penalties, including two 10-minute misconducts, were called by referee Jim McLellan.

Both teams played rough, rugged hockey for ten minutes of the first period, but only one penalty was called. However, at 14:15 of the opening frame, "Twins" goalie Don Childe was charged for interference. It was the goalie's first of two infrac-

tions he received throughout the game. 35 seconds after Childe's first penalty, Jim Hood blinked the red light for Stouffville and that goal was 'curtains' for the "Twins". Four minutes later, Stouffville had vaulted the score to 4-0 on goals by Bill Corner, Pete Reesor and Neil Saunders.

Penalty Parade  
Both teams were so involved in getting penalties in the second period, that a good offensive play was next to impossible. Thirteen penalties marred the middle frame and at one time, there were six men in the penalty box. Sutton-Cannington ruined Chuck Doyle's shutout attempt on a goal by McLeish

at 13:23. Stouffville was a man short at the time.  
A break between the second and third periods should have cooled the teams down. However, at 6:23 of the final frame, Jim Hood was sent off for tripping and eight players followed him in rapid order.  
With ten seconds remaining in the game, Corner hit for his second goal of the night to wrap up the contest at 5-1.  
Misconducts of 10 minutes were handed out to Jim Hood in the second frame and Laird of the "Twins" in the third.  
"Clippers" next home game is Nov. 24th when they play host to Aurora.
