Markham Twp. Police Sgt. Speaks On Safety At Buttonville W.I.

Sgt. Bob Hood of the Markham Twp. Police offered tips for safety, especially at Christmas, when he spoke to members of the Buttonville Women's Institute recently.

Christmas lights can be a hazard, unless proper precautions are taken, said the sergeant. He warned that few things are more tragic than a Christmas fire, and urged that house wiring be checked to make sure circuits are not overloaded with extra lighting.

"Keep your Christmas tree green by adding water to the base," he told his audience. Place tree carefully, well away from window drapes and stairways, and leave lights connected for short periods only. A lighted tree should not be left unattended. A spark will ignite a dry tree so quickly that nothing can be saved.

On Road Safety, the speaker said seat belts should be a must for all motorists. Most fatal motor accidents are caused by the victim being thrown about the vehicle, or tossed to the road, while the car remains fairly intact.

Living Rules governing school buses were other matters touched on: When school bus warning lights are flashing, traffic behind the bus must stop, and all traffic approaching must do so with caution.

Safety with Tractors was another subject dealt with. Children should be tied on securely if they are taken out on one, said Sgt. Hood, adding that of the 7 or 8 fatalities he had investigated over the last ten years, most could have been avoided if some sort of safety belt had been used. Small children, particularly, bounce off if a bump is felt.

The women were interested in police work in general, and asked about court procedure. Sgt. Hood explained that today lawyers play an increasing active part in defending accused persons, and consequently police must increase their knowledge constantly.
