### Farm News Telecast Produced By CBC

Ontario farmers will have an opportunity to see and hear expert discussion on several facets of modern agriculture during January when the Ontario Department of Agriculture, in association with the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation will present three one hour TV programs under the general title, "Let's Look at Farming."

The films produced by the CBC and the Department of Agriculture co-operatively will be shown over a network of fourteen TV stations: January 5, 6 and 7th from 10:30 to 11:30 each morning.

The program on Tuesday, January 5th, under the title "Crops-Changing Systems" will give viewers a look at how and why some farmers decided to make changes in their operation. There will be discussion of crop management decisions based on farm records and on the experiences of others.

Wednesday's program will be devoted to the subject of "Livestock-Managing for Profit," a subject of particular interest to those in the livestock industry.

With the application of sound business principles becoming increasingly evident, Thursdays program "Farm Business-Records, Plans, Decisions" will prove of particular interest. The program will deal with the importance of farm records and their use in arriving at decisions and management.

The programs have been designed to be practical in application and will have over fifteen Ontario Farmers as participants in each field from the Department of Agriculture.

Dr. W. S. Young, of the Department of Crop Science, Ontario Agricultural College, will act as host of the Crops program.

Hosts and specialists on the Livestock program will be H. McGill, Livestock Branch, Ontario Department of Agriculture, Toronto and A. Wall, Extension Branch, Ontario Department of Agriculture, at Newmarket.

The "Farm Business" program will have R. Heard, Farm Management Specialist of the Ontario Department of Agriculture London, as host and commentator.

Announcing the joint presentation of the Ontario Department of Agriculture and the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, Mr. Stewart said that the television broadcasts had been designed to acquaint Ontario Farmers with the latest developments in the three important sections of the agricultural industry.


"I am confident that the programs will prove of value to the farm people of Ontario," said the Minister. "In these rapidly changing times and higher costs of production it is imperative that the newest methods of production and management be made available to those engaged in agriculture."
