FARM REPORT

FARM PRICE PROSPECTS NOT TOO BRIGHT IN '65

(A. A. Wall Agricultural Rep. for York County, Newmarket)

Each year at this time, economists in the Department of Agriculture study farm price prospects carefully. This is of interest to anyone planning farm operations for the year.

Here are a few of the predictions. An increase of about 5% is expected in the number of hogs going to market. Normally this would have a bad effect on prices, but this time lower supplies and better prices in the U.S. are expected to give us a better export market. Our prices in 1965 should be slightly better than in 1964.

Cattle marketings will likely be about 10% higher than in 1964, and this will prevent any general price increase. However, at present prices imports of beef are not likely to come in and prospects are good for export, so that at least prices should not slip any further.

No marked increase in milk production is expected in 1965. Poor crops in parts of Ontario this past year will reduce our normal increase. This along with a relatively low stock of dairy products, should keep prices for manufacturing milk, fairly firm.

The poultry picture isn't very bright for early part of the year at least. Predictions are that more eggs will come on the market in the first six months so there isn't much hope for better egg prices until late in the year. The story is about the same for broilers, with more coming on the market and weaker prices.

With regard to grain prices, yields were well below average last year. The oat crop dropped by 21% and barley had a drop of 25%. Prices for these two grains will likely be higher. The corn picture is better. The crop was up 43% from 1963. However, corn prices will likely hold their own or even increase a little with a lighter crop in the United States and a firm market there.

The potato business is in good shape. Our crop was about the same as last year but production was down in the U.S. so that the export picture is good. The prospects are not very rosy for farmers generally, although no serious problems are expected either. With fairly narrow margins, the pressure is on farm owners to plug any loopholes in the production end of it.

Minister Of Education Presents 9-Year Safety Award At Markham

Six hundred students of the James Robinson Public School in Markham beamed with pride as they watched and heard the Honourable William G. Davis, Minister of Education, present Miss Katherine Monteith, head of the safety patrol, with a plaque commemorating nine consecutive years of accident-free attendance at the school. It is the best safety record in all of Ontario. The ceremony was held Wednesday, Jan. 13th.

Mr. Davis was greeted at the school by twenty crossing guards and the principal, Mr. L. J. Abernathy.

Other special guests on hand for the presentation were Mrs. Alma Walker, Reeve of Markham Village; Mr. M. Hallman, Public School Inspector; Mr. R. Dorey, School Board Chairman; Mr. N. Briscoe, Rotary Club president; Markham; Mr. J. Powell, Kiwanis Club president; Mr. S. Allan, Lions Club vice-president; Mrs. M. Colbourne and Mr. J. Dunsford, both members of the School Board; Mrs. W. Monteith, head of the Home School Association; and Mr. Fred White, Chief of Markham Police.

The principal, addressing his students, explained that the Elmer the Safety Elephant program was founded in October, 1955. He said the students of that year attended classes at the Markham High School, at the completion of the James Robinson School the students were transferred and brought their record of one year with them.

"That," he explained, "is how come we have a nine year old record in an eight year old school."

Mr. Davis, who was introduced by Maynard Hallman, school inspector, told the students that their record was one to be commended, and he congratulated the principal and teachers for their efforts. He warned the children that upon graduation from school, they must carry their safety practices with them through life. The Minister explained that the only place to start a campaign to cut down traffic accidents, is with the children, the future motorists.

Commends Police Force. Referring to Police Chief White, Mr. Davis commented, "you are indeed fortunate in this community to have a man in the police force who takes such an interest in the safety of school children."

Mr. Davis had prepared a speech for the students but disregarded it on the advice of his daughter who explained, "kids don't want to listen to speeches."

In closing, the Minister of Education said, "although it is not my policy to declare holidays on these occasions, I think I can make an exception, and ask your principal to let you out a little earlier tomorrow afternoon."

Barbara Butler, Safety Patrol Lieutenant, presented Mr. Davis with a gift as "a token of appreciation from the school." The gift, two decks of cards, was appropriately selected. Mr. Davis is an avid bridge player.

Grades 6 and 7 witnessed the ceremony, while the remaining students listened in their classrooms over the public address system.

The plaque, donated by the Markham - Unionville Lions Club, has taken its place among the many other awards won by the school.

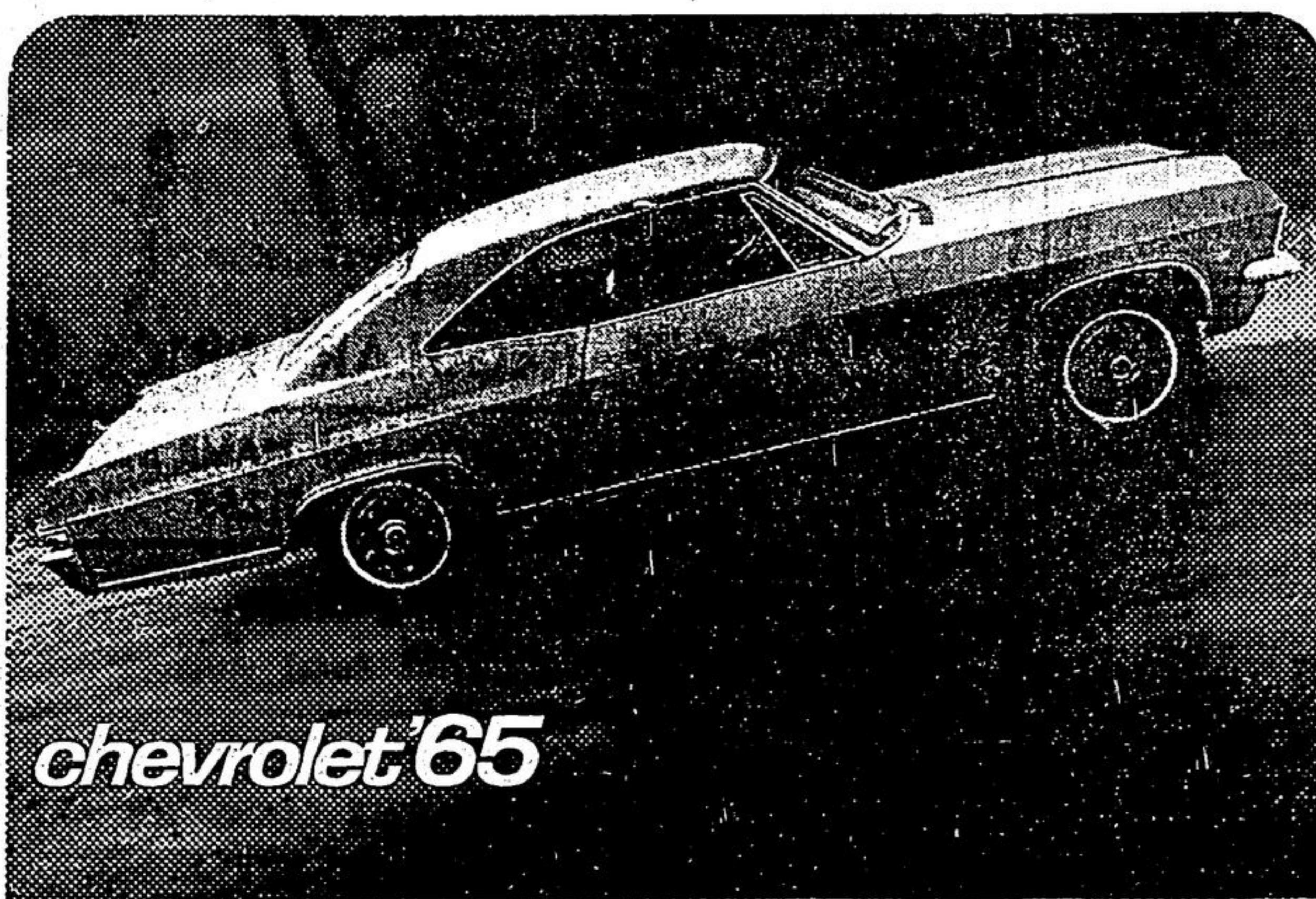
