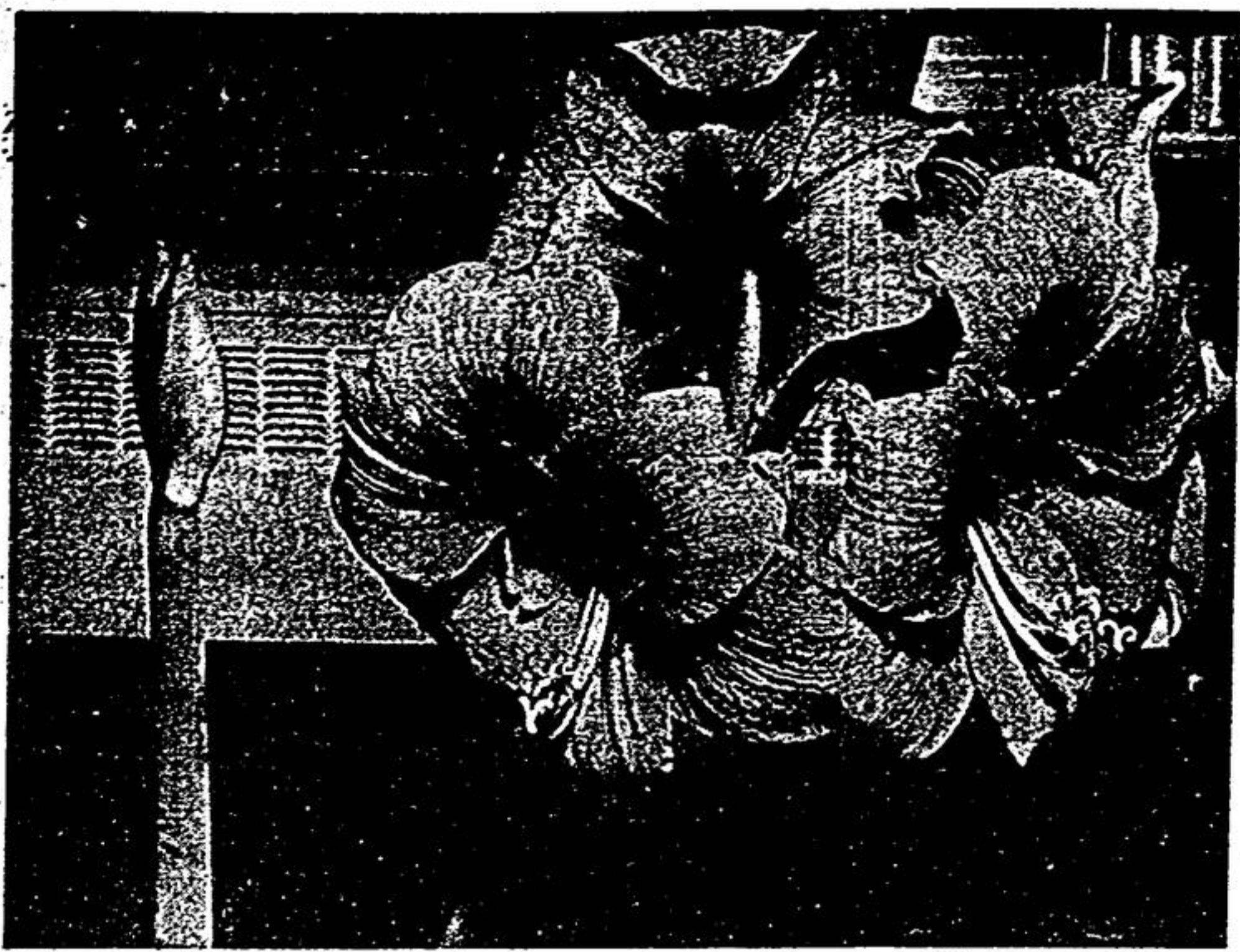


## Amarylis In Bloom

## Claremont District Farmer Wins Seed Potato Award

Albert T. Hockley of R. R. 1, Ontario County Potato Growers Association and 2nd vice-president of the Ontario County Soil and Crop Improvement Association, was awarded the Master Seed Potato Growers Award by the Ontario Fruit and Vegetable Growers' Association January 20. The award, established in 1957, recognizes outstanding contribution to the Ontario potato industry. It takes the form of a lapel pin, a framed certificate, and a listing in the book of recipients.

Mr. Hockley has been growing seed potatoes for many years in the Guelph Seed Potato District.

His farm about three miles from Uxbridge is a model of good management. He uses a three-year or longer rotation and maintains complete control of insects and diseases based on up-to-date methods. Complete sanitation is practiced by seed treatment and the disinfection of bags, storage and all equipment.

This year he grew three fields of Sebago, Norland, Avon and F. 4724 (Elite Stock) together with his general farm program of Yorkshire pigs and beef cattle. Potatoes are his cash crop and 80 per cent is sold for seed.

Besides running a farm-business Mr. Hockley has offered his valuable time and knowledge to many other endeavours. He has been president of the Ontario County 500 Bushel Potato Club, winning the competition himself in 1955. A trustee of the Fifth Line Public School for 20 years. He is president of the

## Foresee Split In Ontario Fed. Riding

Redistribution will split Ontario riding, Michael Starr, Ontario riding member of parliament said last week.

"There is no question about that," he said.

"And while the redistribution commissions are sitting there will be no reason for the Liberals to call an election," said Mr. Starr, "unless the results of the Dorion inquiry are such that they are forced to call one."

He added that the Liberals would be severely criticised for calling an election before redistribution is completed, probably by April, 1966.

Appointments to the commissions have been decided and only a few formalities remain before the massive job begins, according to reports from Ottawa.

Mr. Starr said redistribution will be based on a 70,000 population with a 25 per cent tolerance either way. He suggested that Oshawa and Whitby might form one new riding with the remainder of the present riding joined to surrounding area to make up another riding.

Mr. Starr said it was too early for him to say in which riding he will seek re-election.

Ontario riding at present, includes Oshawa, Whitby, Ajax, Pickering, Port Perry, Uxbridge and Scott.

As a result of redistribution which will bring ridings nearer to representation by population urban areas will be handed a greater number of Commons seats at the expense of rural areas.

The commissions must report to Parliament in one year and the provisions for protesting a commission's boundary setting will require another two or three months, putting the effective date for new ridings about mid-April of next year.

## If You Want Dayliner Service — Say So

Due to a loud and long protest, waged by several influential users of the Toronto to Peterboro dayliner service, the C.P.R. has agreed to continue the train's operation until a hearing can be arranged before the Board of Transport Commissioners. Although no date has been announced, persons closest to this issue, feel that it could come within the next month.

Heading this pro-dayliner committee in Claremont is Mr. Gerald Allman and his son, Gordon.

They are of the firm belief that the Peterboro-Toronto dayliner service does fulfill a great transportation need in the area and its withdrawal would create a hardship on many people. But they want to hear from YOU. This means you, the local resident in the Pickering-Uxbridge area, whether you be a farmer, a merchant or an office-worker.

"Too many people are willing to sit back and say nothing until it's too late," said Mr. Allman, "and then they wonder why it happened".
