Thirteen 4-H Homemaking clubs from across York County participated in the Achievement Day activities at the Dr. G. W. Williams Secondary School in Aurora on Saturday, January 23, 1965. The day was divided into two sessions. The morning was devoted to educational aspects and the afternoon to entertainment. The afternoon program which had been planned by the 4-H members consisted of skits, exhibits and demonstrations.

BOGARTOWN under the leadership of Mrs. William Glover and Miss Brenda Glover of R. R. 3, Newmarket presented a demonstration on good posture. The whole club took part in illustrating what good posture is and how to achieve it. The girls were dressed in black skirts and white blouses. The uniformity of apparel made this demonstration very effective.

EDGELEY under the leadership of Mrs. George Snider, Maple R. R. 1, and Mrs. Roger Gooch of Downsview, R. R. 1, contributed a colourful exhibit, "Good Quality in Cottons." Mary Darlington acted as commentator.

The afternoon program concluded with Miss Austra Janitis, home economist for York County presenting the 4-H Homemaking club sterling silver spoons to all those who completed the project successfully.
