Jailed Four Years For Fatal Car Crash

William Burns, 22 of Oak Ridges, was sentenced to four years in penitentiary for what the judge called a game of cops and robbers; that claimed the life of the accused's friend. Burns, convicted of criminal negligence, was sentenced by Ontario Supreme Court Chief Justice G. A. Gale. The judge also ordered his license suspended for eight years after his release from penitentiary. Evidence was given that Burns' car, skidded off a road on a side road last July as police chased it at speeds in excess of 100 miles an hour. David Howard, also of Oak Ridges, a passenger in the car, was killed. Whitchurch Twp. police look up the chase after receiving a complaint that a lawn chair had been stolen from a home in the area. Evidence showed Burns and Howard had been drinking beer and driving around the area at high speeds. Chief Justice Gale said it had been a "vicious and determined type of negligence." Earlier he noted that Burns had been convicted of impaired driving while awaiting trial over the fatal accident. He also had a previous drunk and an impaired driving charge.
