**MINTED PEACH LAMBIES**  
 Springlike accent to spring lamb patties.  
 1 lb. ground lamb  
 4 strips of bacon  
 1 tsp. salt  
 ¼ cup milk  
 dash of thyme or marjoram  
 4 or more peach halves  
 mint jelly  
 Mix ground lamb with salt, thyme or marjoram and milk. Shape into 4 oval patties. Score with handle of wooden spoon. Drain a can of Canada Choice canned peach halves. Arrange peach halves (halloves up) around lamb patties on broiler pan. Place 5 inches from heat and broil 12 minutes. Turn patties. Broil for 5 minutes longer. Fill centres of peach halves with mint jelly. Top each patty with bacon slice. Broil for another few minutes until bacon is done.
