Congo Missionary To Speak In Markham U.M. Church

The final speaker in this year's Missionary Conference in Markham United Missionary Church, will be the Rev. Peter Stam, who will be speaking on Sunday night at 7:30. Mr. Stam is the General Secretary for Canada for the Africa Inland Mission. There are almost 600 missionaries serving in six countries of central and East Africa. A graduate of Wheaton College, Mr. Stam has been secretary of the Student Foreign Missions Fellowship for two years. He also served as a pastor before going to Africa in 1946. He has served in the Congo for three terms primarily in the work of training African pastors and evangelists. The last five-year term saw two evacuations because of the violence and the danger.
