**Hydrangea Care**

The florists say hydrangea is one of the most popular gift plants for Easter and Mother's day. Horticulturists with the Ontario Department of Agriculture suggest means of taking care of them.

The plant should be placed in a well-lighted location, but shade the blooms from the hot sun. Hydrangeas thrive in a temperature of 60 degrees F. but will tolerate higher temperatures. If the room is very warm or the plant is in a sunny location it may need watering twice a day. However, it should not be kept saturated.

The plant may be carried over for another year. Cut it back halfway after bloom, continue to water and keep in a well-lighted location. When the danger of frost is over, plunge the pot to the rim outdoors in acid soil or peat in partial shade. Do not allow the plant to dry out. The plant will benefit from fertilizer during the summer months. Feed with a complete fertilizer every two weeks, and with iron sulfate (1 ounce per 2 gallons of water) on alternate weeks.

If the plant is growing too tall, pinch the new growth in early July. This will allow time for new shoots to develop and flower buds to set. To promote bud setting, move the plant to full light in early August. Stop feeding by September 1, and move it into a cool, dark storage area before frost. Although it requires little water in storage at 45 degrees F., it should be kept moist. The foliage will drop off while in storage and should be removed to prevent mildew.

For Easter bloom remove the plant from storage after Christmas and place in a temperature of 60 degrees F.
