MASS X-RAY PROGRAM STARTED IN ONT. COUNTY

A total of 15 X-ray technicians and nurses, along with the X-ray units, are being used in the mass TB survey which started in the southern half of Ontario County on Tuesday, May 25. The survey began in Oshawa and, when that city is completed will be carried out in the surrounding municipalities.

Throughout the drive to discover all the unknown cases of tuberculosis in south Ontario County, tuberculin testing clinics and mobile X-ray units will visit all areas of Oshawa, Whitby, Ajax, Pickering, Uxbridge, East Whitch Township, Whitby Twp., Pickering Twp., and Uxbridge Twp. The survey will also be carried into the schools of Scott Twp.

The nurses for the survey have been specially trained for this kind of work, and have been acting at similar clinics all over the province for the past four years. The X-ray technicians have also been carefully selected, some with as much as 20 years experience in community mass survey work.

Dr. H. A. Richmond, general chairman for the survey, says that every person attending the clinics will receive a confidential report on the test or X-ray.

The great majority will show clear and healthy lungs, said Dr. Richmond. "Most cases discovered will be in the early stages when tuberculosis can most quickly and easily be cured."

Under the improved methods used in such survey today, persons who receive the tuberculin test are asked to return to the clinic on a specific day to determine if there has been a reaction to the test. All persons who have a reaction, and all persons over 40 years of age, are then asked to have an X-ray. Diagnosis of tuberculosis is seldom made on the basis of the miniature film taken at the mobile X-ray units.

When a person's film is negative, that means that he is free of tuberculosis at the time. A notification of this will be sent to the individual. If the film reveals suspicious abnormalities, a larger X-ray must be taken for further study, to find out just what the trouble is. It does not mean that the person necessarily has tuberculosis.

John Addison, M.P., Urges Support For Commuter Service

The announcement by the Hon. John R. Pickershill, Federal Minister of Transport, in the House last week to the effect that the Canadian National Railways and the Ontario Government plan to co-operate for the purpose of implementing a commuter service in the Oshawa, Burlington and Barrie area is, I am sure, welcomed by all. In the Ontario house, the Premier announced that the Government has decided to establish an experimental railway commuter service along fifty-two miles of the lake front between Burlington and Dunbar-ton.

Premier Robarts went on to say, "Although the service is being introduced as an experimental pilot project to fully assess its acceptance and capabilities, the government looks to it with high hopes for success so that it might be adopted more extensively in the region and, possibly, other parts of the province."

Over the last three years, while serving on the Railway Committee, I have questioned Mr. Donald Gordon on when commuters to Toronto could look forward to commuter service. Each time, Mr. Gordon replied, that until the C.N.R. Jumpyard in Vaughan Township was completed, no commuter service using C.N.R. lines would be feasible. Mr. Donald Gordon, true to his word, jointly announced only two days after the opening of the new \$75 Million C.N.R. Jumpyard, plans to inaugurate a commuter service in co-operation with the Ontario Government into Metropolitan Toronto.

The Ontario Government in 1962 established a committee, chaired by Mr. R. D. Cowley, made up of municipal and railway officials to study the feasibility of such a service. On April 21st, 1965, Mr. Cowley informed me that public hearings will be held in our area in the fall of 1965 to which agencies, organizations and individuals who have a particular interest will be invited to attend.

Sometime ago I conducted a survey in the riding to see if a commuter service demand did exist, and the replies which I received were overwhelmingly in favour of such a service. On Thursday, May 27th, a group of interested citizens organized by Mr. Robert Silcox and Mr. George Richardson are holding a public meeting in Newmarket to discuss commuter proposals.

It seems to me that in the public hearing to be held this fall by the Metropolitan Toronto and Region Transportation Study Committee, that we in our area, should press both the C.N.R. and the Ontario Government to institute commuter service on the C.N.R. line running from Newmarket, through Aurora, King City and Maple. With the Ontario Government's intention to purchase 48 new, modern, specially designed coaches and 10 diesel locomotives for the Dunbar-Burlington route that very little additional equipment would be necessary for a Newmarket commuter train. The north-south CNR line has an adjacent population of approximately 40,000 people and I would hope that the CNR and the Ontario Government would consider as soon as possible, a modified commuter service starting perhaps with three trains in the morning and three in the evening.

A public notice will be published indicating the time and place for the committee chaired by Mr. Cowley to receive representation from our area. I would urge everybody that is interested to make every effort to attend the meeting.

A Spray Program For Roses

Horticulturists with the Ontario Department of Agriculture suggest a spray program which will give a reliable measure of protection against various rose troubles.

From the time the leaves first

appear, a general spray program should be carried out regularly with brand-name sprays or dusts. Apply the sprays thoroughly and according to the manufacturer's instructions.

To control black spot infection use a brand-name spray or dust and apply thoroughly during May and June. Where mildew is a problem, dust or spray with sulfur or Karathane to keep it in check. Best results are obtained by spraying or dusting in the early morning or evening when the air is still, and foliage is damp.

Make sure that both under and upper surfaces of the leaves are covered. Any leaves with black spot infection should be picked off and destroyed before they fall on the ground. This prevents the disease spreading to healthy foliage.

Rose chafers are prevalent in areas where the soil is sandy and they are difficult to control. Spraying with DDT may offer the best prospects. Aphids can be effectively controlled by spraying with malathion. Red spider mites may be controlled by either malathion or aramite.
