Girl Athletes Score 21 Points At Eckardt Track Meet, Aurora

Of the thirteen boys entered from Stouffville District High School in the Eckardt Meet at Aurora last week, only two attained the roster as point-getters. Thornhill won the meet.

Physical Education Instructor Jim Rehill termed the showing as 'disappointing'.

However, the girls, who managed 21 of the total 27 points scored, saved the school from a last place finish. Eleven schools entered the competitions, Stouffville placing ninth.

Bruce Mehafeff, in the Jr. Pole Vault and Laurie Buckland in the Sr. Pole Vault received five points for their second and third place finishes.

A Junior relay team, comprised of Wayne Wright, Bruce Mehafeff, Dennis Forsythe and Robert Koopman, finished 4th to gain one point.

Mr. Rehill said, that although the team finished further back than last year, most members made a better showing. Last year, Stouffville ranked fifth out of 10 schools.

Cliff Bass, who ran the mile in his best time ever, 5 minutes and four seconds, was nowhere near the winner who trotted the distance in 4 minutes, 36 sec. Bass finished fifth.

Hildegarde Otto made the best showing for Stouffville placing in three events. She came first in the Standing Broad Jump; 2nd in the Running Broad Jump and 4th in the 100 yard dash. Miss Otto is an intermediate.

Other scorers for the Stouffville girls were Linda Wright, (3rd; Sr. High Jump); Karen Dedlow, (2nd; Jr. Running Broad Jump); Donna Skinner, (4th; Junior Shot Put); Lorna Burns, (4th place tie in Jr. High Jump) and the Intermediate Relay team made up of Hildegarde Otto, Yvette Malloy, Jane Terwoerds and Donna Knox. (2nd place).

Donna Knox also qualified for the Intermediate 100 yard dash, but she failed to place.

Other schools entered in the 40th annual track and field competitions for the coveted Eckardt Trophy were Thornhill, Richmond Hill, Bayview, King City, Aurora, Langstaff, Newmarket, Markham, Woodbridge and Huron Heights.
