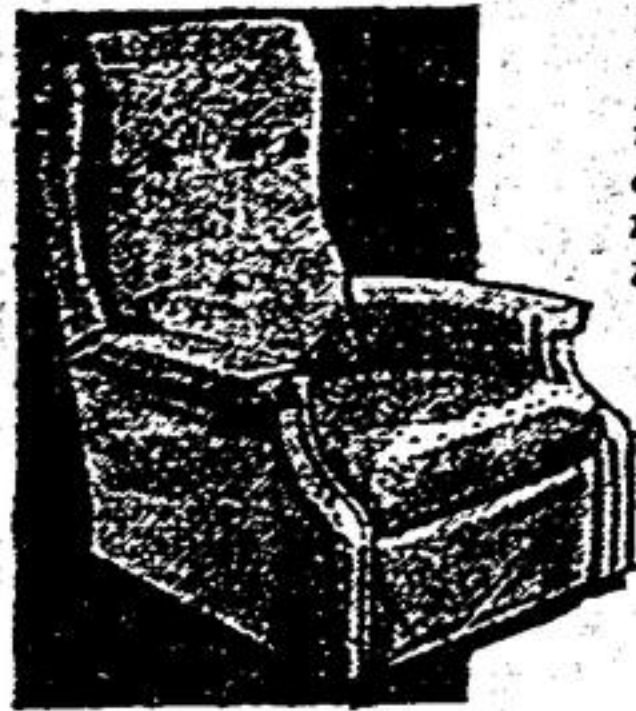

Buttonville residents have been concerned over the fact that the flying club in their midst may become a commercial enterprise with heavier planes for charter.
According to information from staff members at the Board of Transport, the new 4B charter which Buttonville Airport principles have asked for, is out of their jurisdiction and must be granted by the Air Transport Board at Ottawa.
Recently a letter was read in Markham Twp. Council, requesting Council's support in the airport's application "to permit extended facilities for aircraft of the twin-engine type." It was

stated at that time that there is increased demand by executives for this type of service, and the airport asked for approval as soon as possible.

Last week neighbours appeared before Council with a petition in opposition to such a move, and Councilmen could be on the horns of a dilemma: will they support the kitten which could become a tiger? or the local residents, who have only peace and property values to lose? They could, of course, present both points of view to the Government, and leave it to their discretion.
