Local Ratepayer Discusses Many Local Problems

A Musselman's Lake area resident is determined that his vicinity is to be the safest section in Ontario this summer.

Mr. Pat Cashman appeared before Whitechurch Township Council Tuesday night in an effort to halt truckers, slow down speeders, and discourage illegal parking.

Mr. Cashman explained that the community hall on the 15-16th sideroad will be opening in a couple of weeks, and that gravel trucks travelling the road would be a hazard to the children.

However, Reeve Ross Faraharson said that Council could not stop trucks from using a public road. He added that the road, east of the 9th concession, is not heavily travelled.

Regarding parking, Mr. Cashman said he was told a number of cars were illegally parked around the lake on Sunday.

"To every car parked in a no-parking zone, went a ticket," the Reeve answered.

Finally, Mr. Cashman asked Council what could be done about gravel test holes being drilled in the township. He explained that children don't understand "No Trespassing" signs and they could very easily fall into one of the unguarded pits.

Mr. Cashman referred to a dog that was lost and finally found 30 feet below the ground in one of the holes.

"That could have been a child," he said.

The Reeve promised that as soon as Police Chief Fred Mason returns, he will ask that fences be erected around the pits.

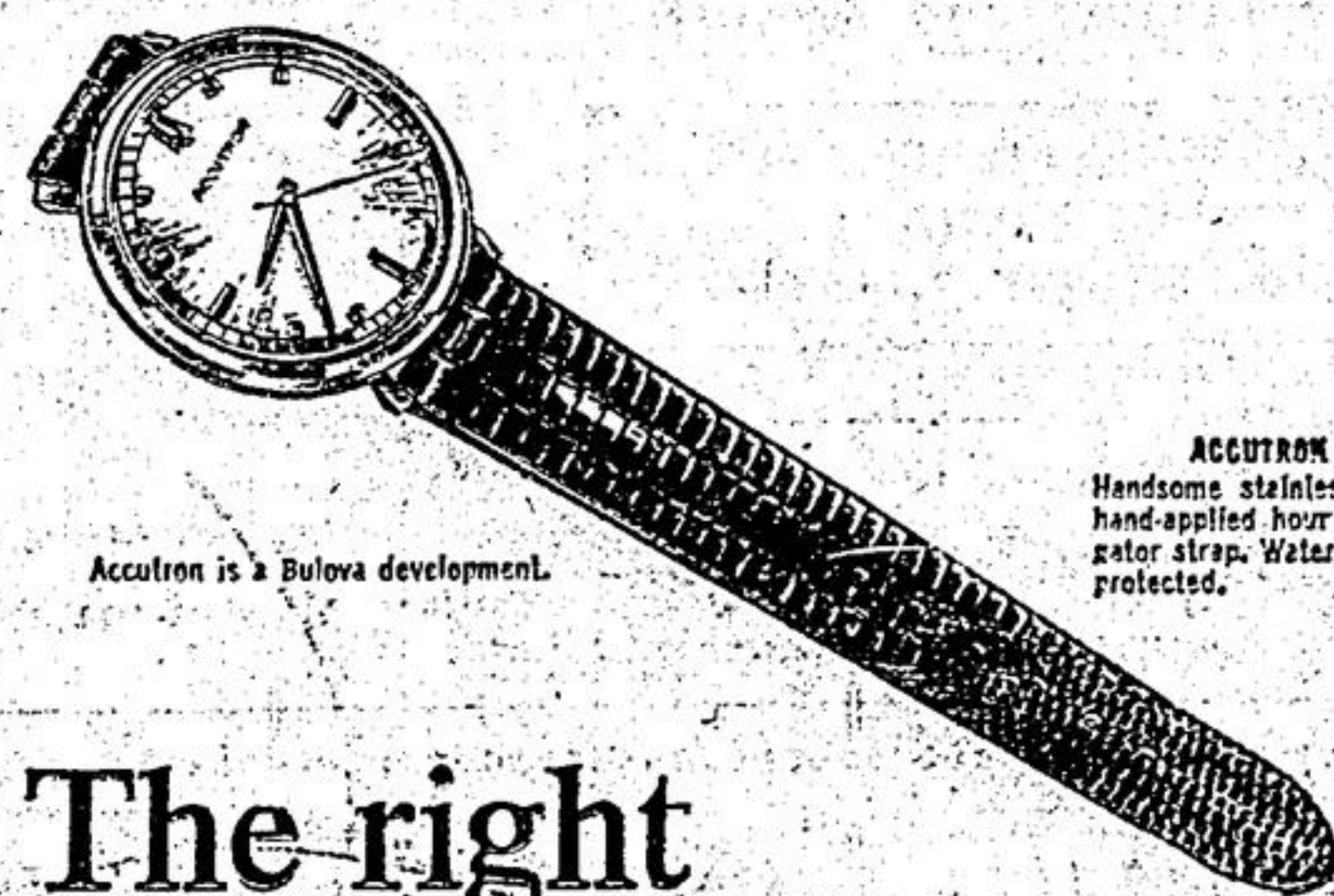
The Oshawa Naturalists invaded the woods at the Pondanosa farm of Mr. and Mrs. Edgie Pegz last week.
