## Report From Parliament

The new rules and procedures were finally approved and passed last Friday. They became effective on Monday, July 14th, on a temporary basis for the balance of the present Session and for all of the next Session. They will have to be reviewed from time to time and quite likely altered if found to be unworkable in their present form.

The Prime Minister has left to attend the Commonwealth Prime Ministers' Conference, which is being held in London, England. Before leaving, he listed a number of pieces of Legislation and Resolutions that he hoped would be dealt with prior to a summer recess of Parliament.

Some of the matters to be dealt with are—

The Act respecting Banks and Banking. This Act will only receive second reading and will then be referred to the Committee on Banking and Commerce. The Minister of Finance will have to ask Parliament to extend the effects of the Bank Act, prior to July 1st of this year, in order to permit the banks to operate beyond that date.

A resolution to set up a Joint Committee of the Senate and House of Commons to consider the state of penitentiaries under the control of the Government of Canada.

The Budget Resolutions will have to be dealt with in order to give effect to the 10% income tax reduction as of July 1st. These resolutions give effect to all matters referred to in the Budget.

The Committees provided under the new regulations will have the Estimates referred to them for their consideration. This will have the effect of accelerating these Estimates and at the same time afford a better opportunity for scrutiny of the expenditures of all of the Government Departments. After they come back to the House of Commons, thirty days are provided for their discussion by members in general terms and on the policies involved in these Estimates.

The order paper listing Government business contains resolutions to establish a Science Council of Canada and to change the name of the Research Council Act to the formal title of the National Research Council.

A Resolution appears which provides for the introduction of a measure to amend the Fisheries Improvement Loans Act. The purpose of the amendment is to increase the maximum loan amount to a fisherman from four thousand dollars to ten thousand dollars and to increase the maximum repayment period from eight years to ten years

and also extend the period during which guaranteed loans may be made for a period of 5 year from June 30, 1965, to June 30, 1970.

There are not many contentious Acts or Resolutions to come before the House prior to a summer recess. What may be introduced after that period is another matter. If the Speech from the Throne is implemented in full there will be some debatable matters under discussion.

### Farm Repair Complaints Should Be Made To Machinery Advisory Bd.

The extreme pressures encountered in modern farming methods, and the increase in the size of many farm operations, mean that any prolonged delay in seeding, haying or harvesting can be extremely critical. Under today's farming conditions, it is imperative that all farm equipment be maintained at peak operating efficiency. This means that when a breakdown or failure of equipment does occur, the time loss due to such failure must be kept to a minimum.

The Ontario Federation of Agriculture wishes to draw attention to the functions of The Ontario Farm Machinery Advisory Board. The Advisory Board was set up by the Ontario Department of Agriculture because of the volume of complaints that had been received of the unavailability or delays that had been experienced in obtaining repair parts for farm machinery. Its chief function is to investigate all such cases in order to determine the availability of parts and establish the cause of delays in procurement.

We would emphasize that, if an investigation is desired, it is the responsibility of the farmer to notify the Farm Machinery Advisory Board of any problems he may encounter in this connection. This should be done in writing and the letter should provide the Board with as much detail as possible. This should include the location of the farm, the date and nature of the breakdown in equipment, the make and model of the machine, the part number, the date or

### CANADA'S NEW LABOUR CODE/Hon. Allan MacEachen, Minister of Labour, answers some questions:

"Our new Canada Labour Code has been called a 'first', Mr. MacEachen. Would you agree?"

"Yes, and it is one of the most all-embracing. Canada has a right to be proud of it. It sets higher standards than have been set for any other country I know. Other countries are taking note of the way Canadian Parliament is ensuring that more workers share in this country's growth."

"Briefly, who does this new Code apply to?"

"It applies to industries which fall under Federal jurisdiction—and may well prove to be a guide for other industries. The Government itself, which is a large employer in its own right, will take the lead by applying the Code's standards to its own federal employees."

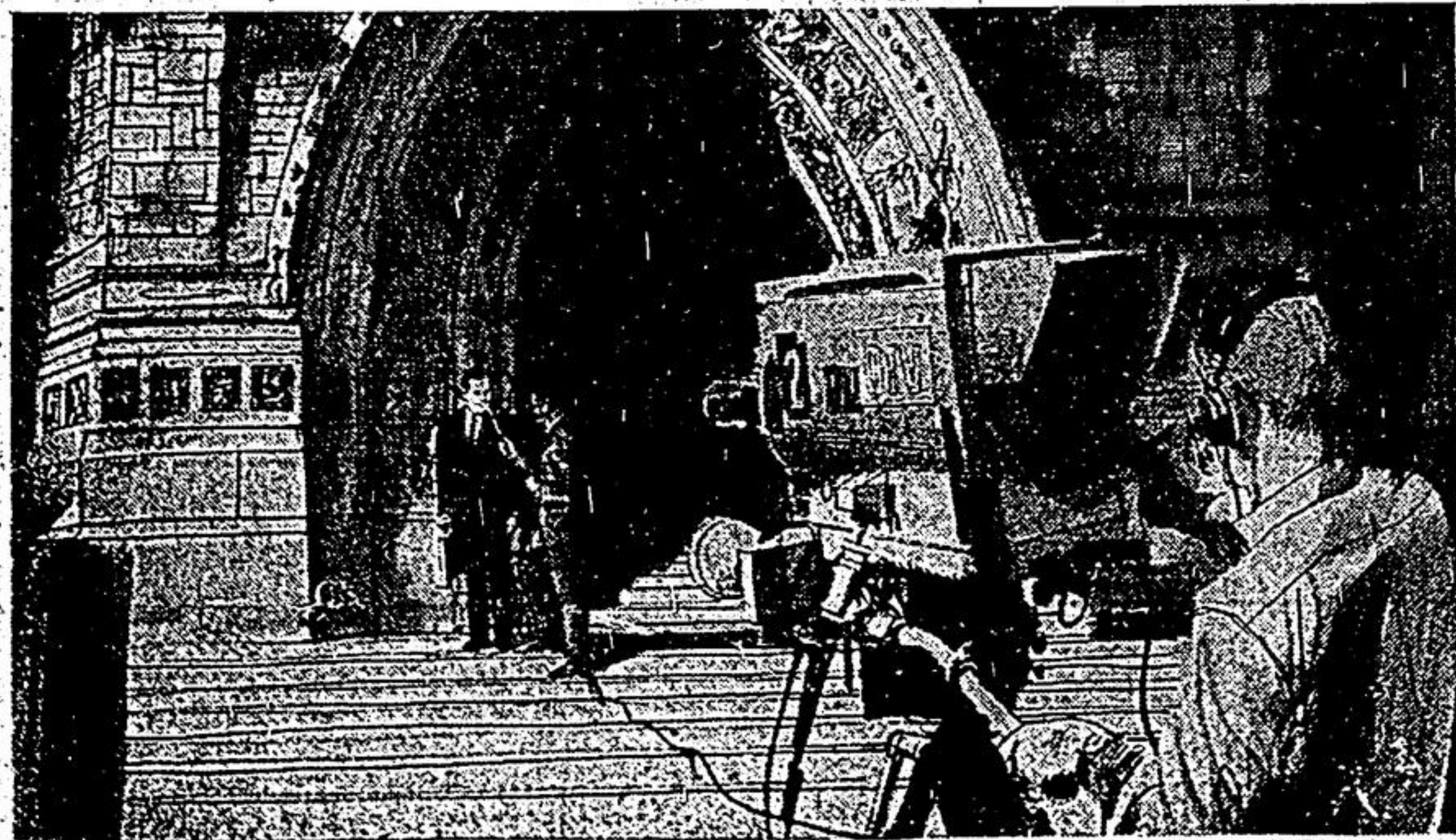
"Let's get down to specifics. What, exactly, does it promise to those employees who are affected by it?"

"As we said, it sets minimum standards—and I stress that these are minimum, because, of course, a lot of workers already enjoy higher standards than the Code sets. First, it sets a standard 8 hour day and a 40 hour week, with overtime limited to 8 hours a week, and paid for at time-and-a-half. Second, it sets the minimum wage rate for all men and women over 17 years of age at \$1.25 an hour. Next, it provides for two weeks annual vacation with pay, after one year's service; or 4% of wages as vacation pay for those with from 30 days to a year's service. Finally, it stipulates that each employee shall get eight statutory holidays with pay a year—or get a full day off in lieu of the holiday."

"You said the new Code applies to industries under Federal jurisdiction. Would you name them?"

"The Code covers interprovincial or international rail and highway transport, primary fishing where the fishermen work for wages, air transport, radio and TV, shipping, banks, uranium mining, grain elevators, flour and feed mills and warehousing, seed cleaning mills, interprovincial or international pipelines and ferries, interprovincial or international telegraphs and telephones, most Crown corporations and one or two other smaller industries."
