**On The Farm Front...**

(A. A. Wall, Agricultural Representative, York County)  
 Dry weather continues to dominate the farm situation in York County. My estimate is that total hay yield is down by about one-third. Grain and corn crops are doing fairly well but certainly not making normal progress. Lack of moisture doesn't affect these crops too badly at this stage. The more crucial stage is when grain is filling and when corn plants are a lot bigger and requiring a lot of moisture to keep them going. To me, the chance of a real pasture shortage from now on is the biggest worry. There is no regrowth on hay fields, and regular pastures are being grazed down very quickly. And it takes more than a few scattered showers to make any real difference on sod fields. Using grain fields to supplement roughage is sound. I doubt however, if many farmers will turn cattle into grain fields to pasture. Natural pasturing doesn't make the best use of grain for roughage. Cattle have to be put on a field before it has reached its full growth, and there is usually a fair amount of wastage. Harvesting the crop as silage solves both of these problems. Ensiled at the dough stage, oats will provide just as much food as they will harvested for grain. Oat silage could be fed out in late August and September and save the day if dry weather continues. Another point that should get a lot of thought this year, is whether to plow up sod for wheat or not. Again there is pasture supply to think about. As well, I think this year's new seedlings are a question mark right now. A lot of the alfalfa plants are very spindly and some stands are very thin. A good rain would smarten them up in a hurry, but those who depend on good soaking rains in July are more courageous gamblers than I am. I would be more willing to sacrifice next year's wheat crop than this year's pasture and next year's hay. Hay yields this year have been quite variable. Some fields have put up close to normal yields while others could almost have been cut with a lawnmower. Generally, it has been the good alfalfa mixtures that have been fertilized regularly each fall that have done well. Most people who scatter fertilizer on sod in the fall have some doubts about what is happening to their money. A year like this removes most of that doubt.
