Crop Prospects Improved By Heavy Rain Fall

(A. A. Wall, Agricultural Representative, York County).
 After the dry months of May and June, rain is big news in the farm business. Last Wednesday's downpour really got a lot of crops on their feet again. Grain, corn, potatoes and vegetables are in fairly good shape now, and yield prospects look good.
 Regrowth on hay stubble is starting and if rain continues, we could have good yields on second cut. The effects of the low first-cut yields are showing up in hay prices. Some quite fantastic rumours about prices being offered and paid, have spread around the county.
 The only people that have to worry about high prices of course, are those that have to buy. Hay is a basic part of any ration for cattle but I think when the rate gets to the reported dollar a bale figure, buyers would have to look for alternatives. After all, ordinary hay is only about 50% digestible compared to grain which is usually from 75% up.
 Corn silage can be used to stretch out hay. In some areas, dairy heifers are fed on silage alone and they don't appear to miss the hay. Milking cows do need hay, but often more silage could be substituted for it.
 The amount of silage that can be put up, is normally limited by the amount of silage space. This really need not be a limit though, in a short hay year. Several farmers here in York have piled or stacked silage in the open. It isn't the neatest, dirtiest and easiest way to feed cattle, but it works. There is some spoilage, but if it's fed out early in the winter, losses aren't too high.
 I expect that some of the corn planted for grain this year could be used just as profitably as silage, in stacks, to take the pressure off the hay supply.
