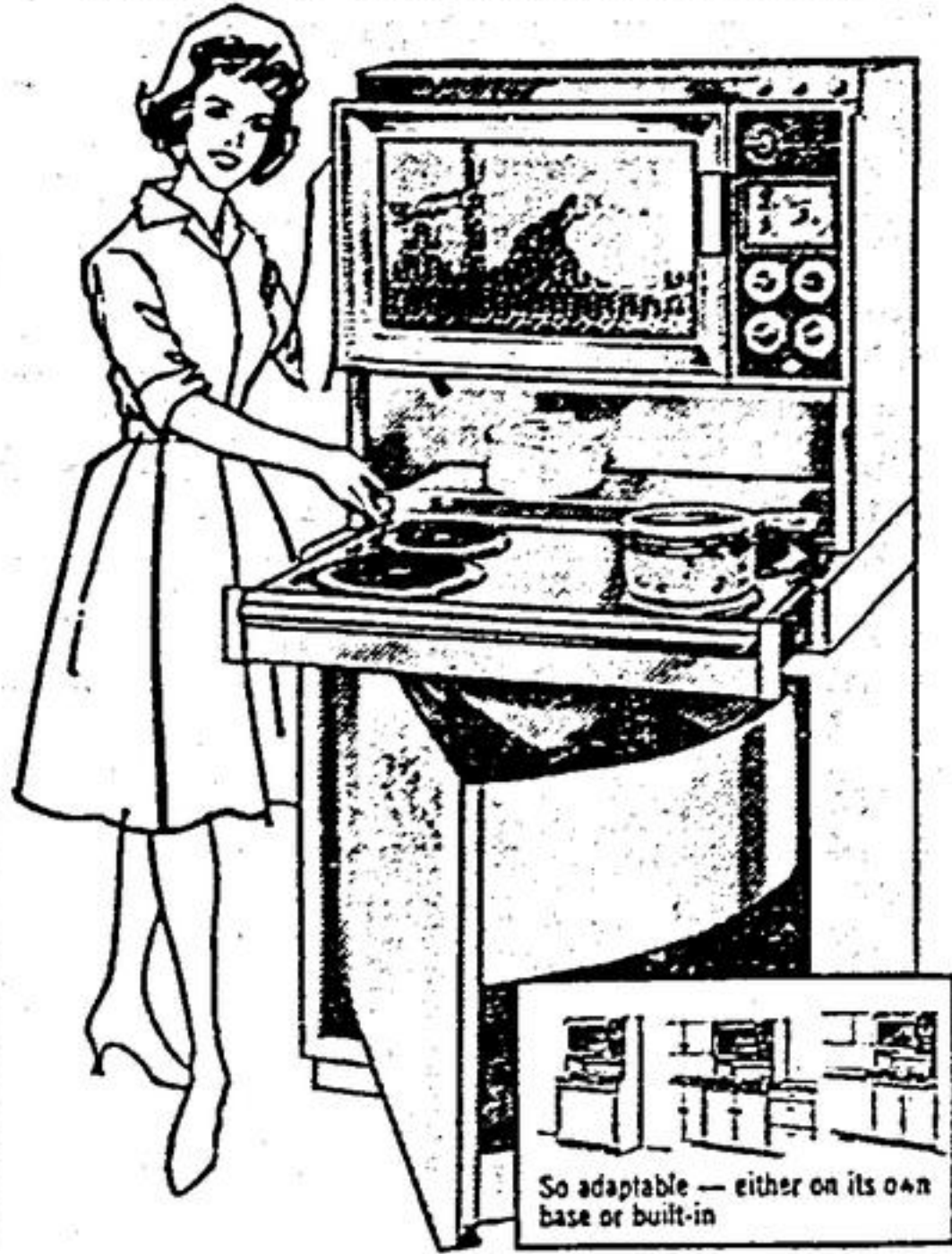

## Jehovah's Witnesses To Attend Convention

Mr. Vic Overall, presiding minister of Jehovah's Witnesses made known today, July 15th, that the Stouffville congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses has been invited to attend a four-day assembly to be held July 22 to 25 at Memorial Community Centre, Peterborough, Ont. Mr. Overall will head the local delegation of about 40 persons. The Assembly is being arranged by the Watchtower Bible Society of Toronto for the congregations of Jehovah's Witnesses located in eastern Ontario and including some of the English-speaking ones from the province of Quebec. An attendance in excess of 5,000 is expected.

## "Racing" Charge Laid Against Two Drivers

The first charge of racing cars to come before Magistrate Russell Pearce in fifteen years was heard in Richmond Hill Court Friday.

Charged by Markham Township Police, Thomas M. Osler of Willowdale was found guilty and fined \$100 and costs. A witness, Richard Fowlston of Willowdale, testified that on May 19th, he heard loud noises caused by tires squealing and engines roaring. Coming to the front of his home on Grandview Ave., he noticed two cars racing side by side down the street. He said that as they approached Dudley Street, both cars stopped, with one skidding into the centre of the intersection. Mr. Fowlston added that they lined up at the corner and took off again at a high rate of speed. The witness said one car came back and he was able to obtain a license number and a fair description of the driver.

P.C. Bruce Findlay, when questioning Osler, said the accused admitted racing with another man along Grandview Avenue. Osler, in his own defense, called Michael Dawson, the other person allegedly racing, to explain their actions.

Dawson said that he was simply testing a car that he was repairing. Magistrate Pearce said, however, that he believed the testimony of the eye-witness and levied the fine against Osler. The Magistrate also suspended Osler's license for 30 days.

Dawson, charged separately on the same count, chose to have his case heard by a different Magistrate after Mag. Pearce advised him that the trial would not be fair. Dawson's case comes up the first week in October.

A milkman was brought before the local county court to answer a charge of watering his milk. "You are charged," said the judge, "with a most serious offense of selling adulterated milk. Have you anything to say for yourself?" "Well, your honour," replied the man, "the night before it was raining very hard and the only cause I can give is that the cow must have got wet clear through."

## Markham Village, Twp. Over Million Dollars In Industrial Assess.

Aurora is still the most "industrial" of York County's towns — and King Township is still its most rural section.

These facts emerge from a review of the county's assessment report presented recently to county council.

Aurora's tax base of almost sixteen million dollars assessment shows that more than \$2,800,000 of it is industrial — 17.5 percent of its total assessment. This compares with less than 10 percent in Newmarket and 7.6 percent in Richmond Hill. Of all York's 14 municipalities, only the village of Woodbridge shows a higher percentage of industrial assessment (19.1).

In assessment dollar values, Aurora still tops Richmond Hill by \$200,000 for industry. Newmarket industrial assessment totals more than \$1,500,000 or almost \$1,300,000 less than Aurora.

Markham village and Markham township are the only

other municipalities in the county which top the million dollar mark in industrial assessment.

King Township's assessment records show about one-third of its \$17,300,000 assessment rated as "farm" — the highest percentage in that category among the three towns, four villages and seven townships which make up the county.

King Township also remains the largest single unit in area. Its 89,000 acres constitute far more than one-fifth of the entire county.

Aurora's population on the tax books is 9,903; King Township is 13,303; Whitechurch Township has 7,656.

Richmond Hill dominates York in population (19,229) and assessment (\$34,450,000).

The county has a total population of 126,617. Total assessment is about \$195,000,000.
