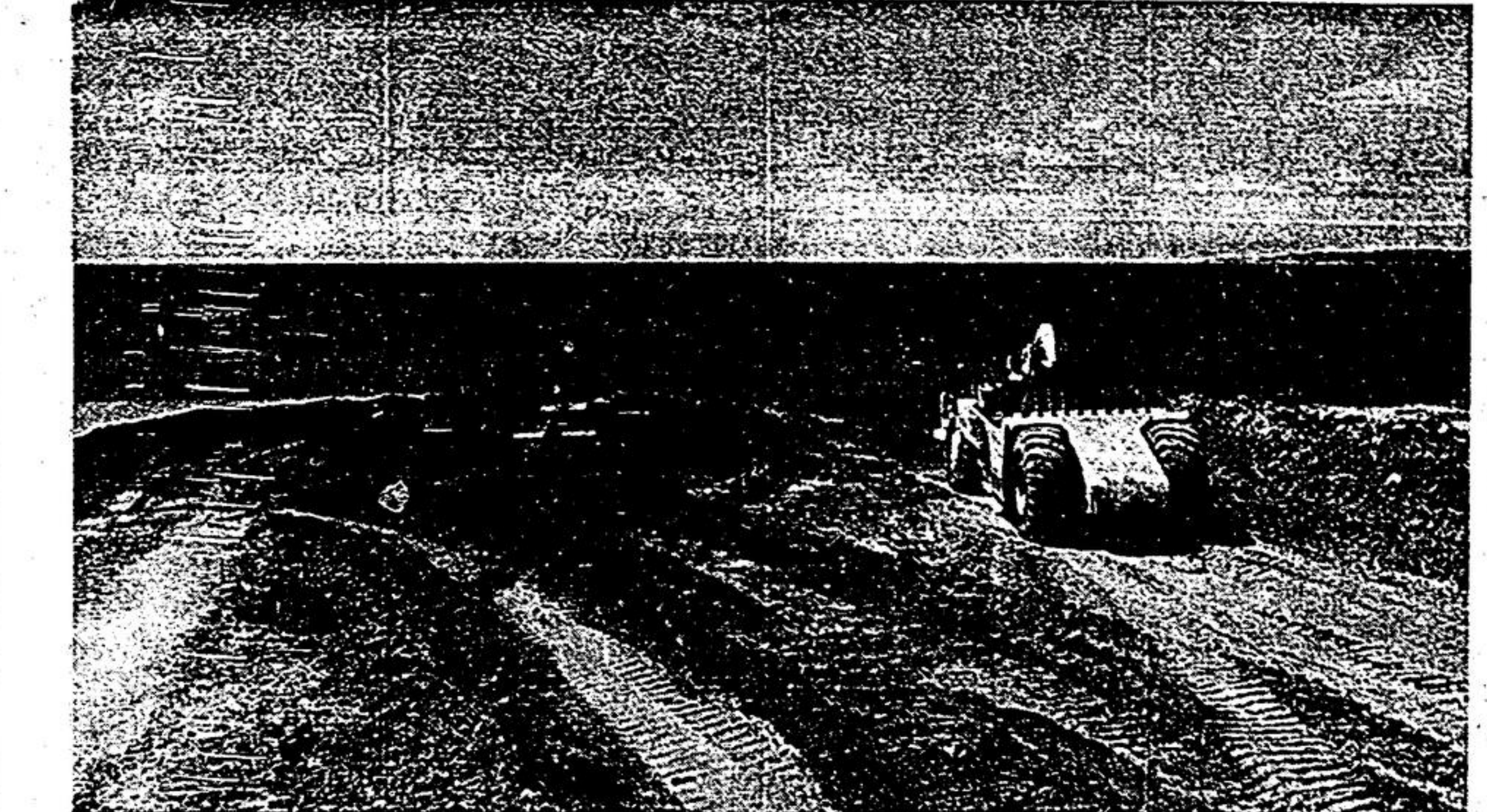

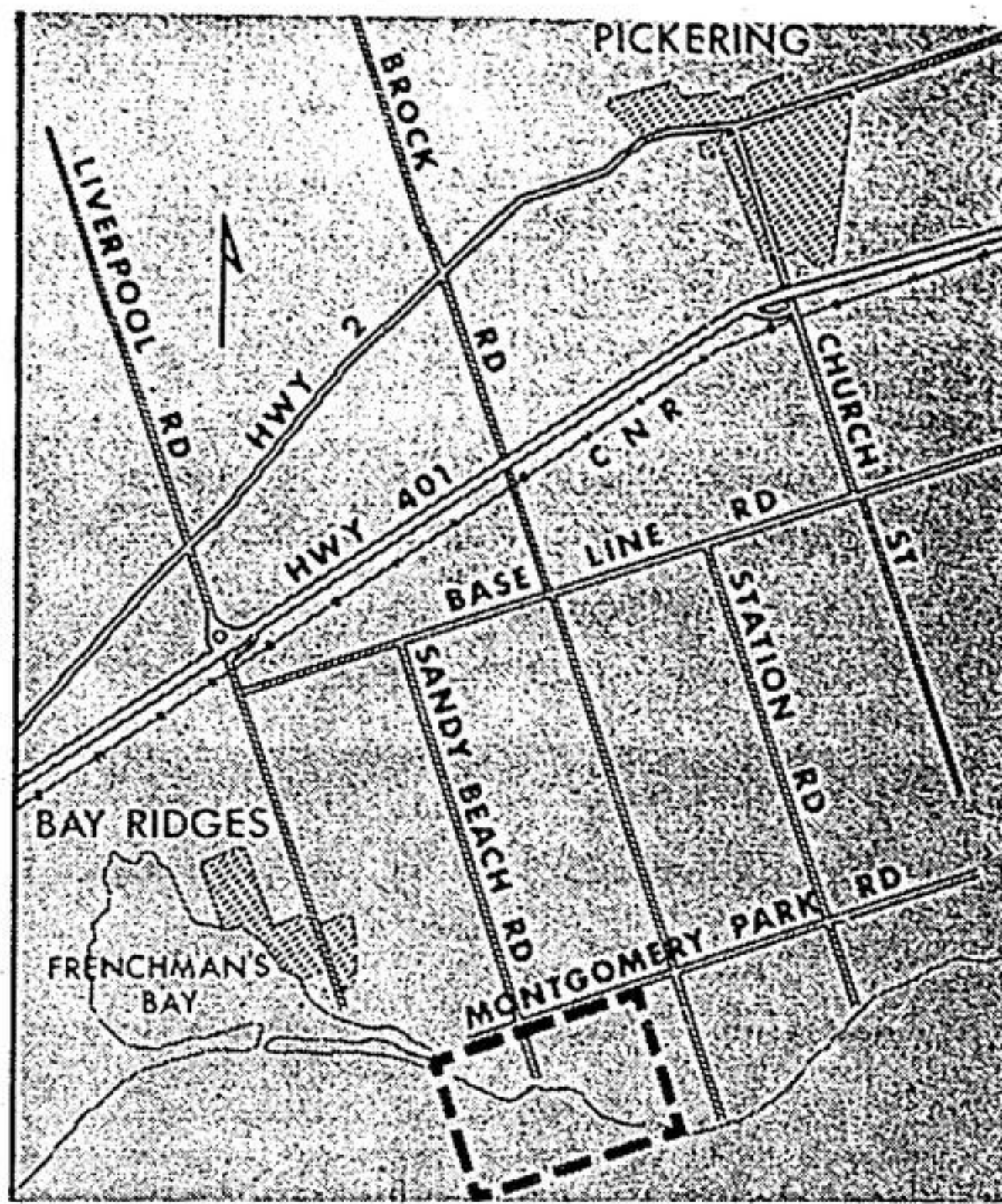

Alter Ground Level, Shoreline, For Hydro's New Nuclear Plant

Giant earth-moving machines are levelling and lowering the site of Ontario Hydro's Pickering nuclear power station on Lake Ontario. The machines grind constantly back and forth, to lower the ground level 26 feet in some places and 12 feet in others.

Shielding for the reactor buildings, about 168 feet tall will be erected. Excluding work on township roads, about 65 men are on the site now; peak work force is expected to exceed 800 men before the station goes into initial service in 1970.
