New Pastor Begins Ministry Aug. 15 At Dickson's Hill

Now Is Separate Charge
 Mr. Ronald Faw who was recently called as pastor of the Dickson's Hill United Missionary Church will commence his ministry this coming Sunday, August 15th.

Mr. Faw comes from Aylmer, Ontario, where he was born. He attended public school in the area and is a graduate of the East Egin District High School. This past year he graduated from Emmanuel Bible College, Kitchener, with the Bachelor of Theology Degree, and this summer completed his work for his Bachelor of Arts Degree at the Waterloo University College in Waterloo.

The coming of Mr. Faw to Dickson's Hill marks the beginning of a new era in the life of the Dickson's Hill and Markham U.M. Churches for this is the first time that each church has had its own pastor. Through the years both churches have been served by one pastor, resident in Markham.

At the turn of the century, the Markham circuit consisted of Mt. Joy, Dickson's Hill, Bethesda, Altona, Vaughan and Gormley. In 1903 a church was started in Stouffville and Altona and Stouffville became a separate pastoral charge. In 1908 Vaughan was discontinued, and for the next 26 years Mt. Joy, Dickson's Hill, Bethesda and Gormley remained as one circuit. In 1934 Gormley and

Bethesda became a separate charge. Growth in recent years has now made possible another division making Dickson's Hill and Markham two separate appointments. It is believed by the two congregations that this will result in increased growth and expansion for both churches.

A very fine addition to the Dickson's Hill Church is now nearing completion. Plans are being made to hold a dedication service on Sunday, September 5th.

CLEAN UP YOUR ROSE BED

Now that the first crop of bloom is over, clean up your rose bed, suggest horticulturists with the Ontario Department of Agriculture.

Cut back the stems that have flowered to two or three buds. All leaves that show black spot should be picked off and burnt. Infected leaves which have fallen on the ground should be picked up and destroyed to prevent the disease from spreading to healthy plants, and also to prevent it overwintering in the soil.

A regular spray program should be carried out with a suitable brand-name rose spray or dust. These materials should be applied thoroughly and according to the manufacturer's directions.

New Furniture Plant In Markham Twp. To Cost Over \$1,000,000

Edward G. Fritz, president Canadian Steelcase Company Limited, has announced that construction has started on the firm's new office furniture manufacturing plant in the Don Mills Industrial Park, Markham Township.

Negotiations for the new plant were carried out with Anthony Roman, prominent Markham businessman, who has been active in township planning. The land was formerly owned by Denison Mines.

The new building is the firm's fourth expansion in ten years and is expected to cost over \$1,000,000. It will employ about 150 people, according to Mr. Fritz and will be the largest building in Markham Township when completed. It will double present Steelcase office and display space and will more than double its manufacturing area. Construction will be completed in January, 1966.

Steelcase is one of Canada's largest manufacturers of fine executive and general office furniture. The new building will provide increased facilities to supply the country's rapidly increasing business furniture market. Steelcase products are sold through independent dealers in all cities across Canada.

The new building was designed by Crang and Boske, Architects of Toronto. Finley W. McLachlan is general contractor. Located on a 20-acre site, near the intersection of Don Mills Road and Steeles Avenue, the structure will provide 150,000 square feet of manufacturing space and 17,000 square feet for administrative offices and showrooms. A series of room-size office settings will display the firm's desks, chairs, files and data processing auxiliary equipment.

The building will replace the present Steelcase plant and

office building in Don Mills. The original structure, built in 1955, provided 12,000 square feet of manufacturing space. It was expanded to 59,000 square feet in 1960 and to 76,000 in 1962.

Councillor Hoover Opposes \$50,000 Park Debenture In Markham

Councillor Charles Hoover, who has protested Markham Township's Centennial Park project from the beginning, continued to show his disapproval last week at a meeting of council when he voted against a by-law to provide for a \$50,000 debenture toward the purchase price of the park site.

However, despite his stand, the by-law was given a third reading and passed by the rest of council.

The by-law called for debentures to be sold at not less than \$50, with an interest of 5 1/2 per cent per annum.

Reeve Charles Hooper suggested the amount be changed to read not less than \$100, but Mr. Hoover objected.

"I took the stand that I wasn't in favor of the park and I see no reason to change my mind," he said.

Councillor Allan Sumner said that that wasn't the point, it was merely to change the amount of the debenture shares.

The reeve's suggestion was put into a motion and was carried by council, along with the by-law, with only Mr. Hoover voting against it.
