New Esso Award For Plowing Champions

Alex McKinney of Brampton, president of the Canadian Plowing Council, has announced the acceptance by his organization of the Esso Travel Award, granted by Imperial Oil Limited. This new award will provide funds for an agricultural and educational tour by the winners of the 1965 Canadian Plowing Championship Contest.

Under the terms of the award, the 1965 Canadian Champion and the runner-up will travel to another country during 1966. The winners to participate will be selected at the Canadian Championship Plowing Contest to be held at Milliken on Oct. 13 and 14. This national event will be held in conjunction with the Ontario provincial plowing match. It is expected that 16 plowmen from eight provinces will compete for the Esso Silver Plow and the right to participate in the Esso Travel Award.

The Canadian Plowing Council president expressed appreciation for the generous support which his organization receives from many interested industries in achieving its objectives.

"The Council seeks to promote interest in good plowing as an art, but more particularly as the foundation of improved agricultural technique, an important prerequisite to meeting world hunger," said Mr. McKinney. The plow has long been used as a universal symbol of peace, a noteworthy attribute in today's confused world.

Mr. McKinney, himself an active dairy farmer, observed that the Canadian Plowing Council through its activities, and more particularly through its annual

competition for which this travel award was granted, provides another means of strengthening the bond of friendship and understanding which exists between agriculture and related industries. At the same time, the national plowing contest offers an avenue for closer ties between farmers in various parts of this huge nation.

In recent years the participation of Canadian contestants in world wide competitions for plowing honours, and their travel to many foreign countries to compete, has provided direct contact between Canadian farmers and individual farmers in many nations. The new award will not only ensure that such contacts may continue, but will make possible the inclusion of more educational aspects in the tour plans for the Canadian winner.

The new travel award will in no way affect Imperial Oil's active membership in the Canadian Plowing Council, or its sponsorship of prize awards at the Canadian Plowing Championship Contest, Donald Dunkeld, of Claremont, Ont., the 1964 Canadian champion plowman, and Dr. Carl Willis, of Charlotteville, as declared at the national contest near Charlotteville last October, will represent Canada in the 13th World Plowing Contest in Norway on October 8 and 9, 1965, travelling as the guests of Imperial Oil Ltd.

Mr. McKinney pointed out in his announcement that since there will be no world contest held in 1966, the new award will help maintain interest in the Canadian contest and offer additional incentives by providing the winners with an opportunity to travel abroad.

At the same time it was announced that the Canadian Championship Contest for 1966 will be held in April at Chilliwack, B.C. This will mark the first time that it has been held on the west coast, although British Columbia plowmen have been prominent competitors in many previous national events.

ANNOUNCEMENT

Ontario Hospital Insurance will now cover dependent children to 21st birthday

Beginning September 1, 1965, benefits under the Ontario Hospital Insurance "Family" premium will be extended to cover eligible unmarried, unemployed dependent children until they reach their 21st birthday (rather than to the 19th birthday as in the past). This will apply, also, to the supplementary "semi-private" coverage for which some residents remit additional premiums to private carriers through the Commission.

Separate premiums will be required when such dependants reach age 21, or marry, or become regularly employed. Applications for registration are available in hospitals, banks, Province of Ontario Savings Offices and Commission offices.

The Family premium, however, will cover a person over age 21 who is dependent upon the insured parent or guardian because of physical or mental infirmity, provided he or she was the insured person's dependant before age 21.

Refund of Premiums

An unmarried, unemployed person who was not become eligible as a Family dependant under age 21 because of this new regulation, and for whom separate premiums have already been prepaid beyond September 1, 1965, is entitled to a refund of premiums back to that date. Refunds must be requested as this is the only means of identifying those eligible. The form at the bottom of this announcement is for the convenience of Pay Direct members in claiming this refund. Premiums prepaid through a group (other than as an employee) will be refunded through the group.

Note:

Commission literature is being changed to show the new age limit. In the meantime, please read all references to age 19 in existing pamphlets as "age 21".
