## To Deal With Use Of Abandoned Schools

The future use of abandoned schools in Pickering Twp. Area No. 1 is the concern of Planning Board and the problem was the subject of discussion at a recent meeting.

School buildings at Mt. Zion and Balsam will not be re-opened in September. A request has been received to turn one of the structures into an art studio and living quarters.

Board member, Rex Merritt was of the opinion that none should be used as residences.

"In view of what we are experiencing in the south end, abandoned schools deteriorate very rapidly," he said. "Schools are a non-conforming use wherever they go," he continued, "should we encourage their continued use for anything?"

Mrs. Jean McPherson observed that in some other municipalities they had been used both as art centres and homes.

The board agreed that each school should be dealt with individually and each application should be studied on its own merit.
