

Lady leachers Seek Pay Increase

The women public school teachers of Ontario approved a new recommended salary schedule for themselves last week. It would raise the recommended salary for a woman teacher with a basic certificate and no experience to \$3,600 from \$3,400 a year. A certififormer Mary Forsyth. cate, basic degree and 10 years experience would earn her \$10,000, a raise of \$1,600 from the present recommendation. The schedule was approved by the 500 delegates representing the 24,000-member Federaation of Women Teachers Association of Ontario at its annual

neeting in Toronto. The new schedule now will be reviewed in co-operation with the men teachers federa-

Florence Henderson of Sault Ste. Marie, finance committee conver, explained that the new schedule emphasizes the impor tance of a degree and offers incentive for further study. The recommended salary for

a beginner with a degree is \$5,500 and the first several raises recommended are \$500 a year, compared with \$400 in the lower categories. At the same time, the

FWTAO is planning a brief to the provincial committee on teacher education and certification to urge that elementary teachers meet the same basic academic qualification as secondary teachers, and that after 1972 a teacher entering the profession be required to have a degree.






