## Ont. Lady Teachers Seek Pay Increase

The women public school teachers of Ontario approved a new recommended salary schedule for themselves last week.

It would raise the recommended salary for a woman teacher with a basic certificate and no experience to \$3,800 from \$3,400 a year. A certificate, basic degree and 10 years experience would earn her \$10,000, a raise of \$1,600 from the present recommendation.

The schedule was approved by the 500 delegates representing the 24,000-member Federation of Women Teachers Association of Ontario at its annual meeting in Toronto.

The new schedule now will be reviewed in co-operation with the men teachers' federation.

Florence Henderson of Sault Ste. Marie, finance committee convener, explained that the new schedule emphasizes the importance of a degree and offers incentive for further study.

The recommended salary for a beginner with a degree is \$5,500 and the first several raises recommended are \$500 a year, compared with \$400 in the lower categories.

At the same time, the FWTAO is planning a brief to the provincial committee on teacher education and certification to urge that elementary teachers meet the same basic academic qualification as secondary teachers, and that after 1972 a teacher entering the profession be required to have a degree.

Delegates approved a suggestion from Ruby McLean of Leamington, superannuation commissioner, that the years for computing pensions be decreased to the best three from the best seven.

After a lengthy debate they approved a resolution that FWTAO membership fees continue at three-quarters of one per cent of salary, but with a \$50 maximum. There is currently no maximum.

They approved a recommendation from Hazel Farr of Simcoe, finance chairman, that fees returned to the association be based on \$3.50 a member and that no association receive less than \$400.
