

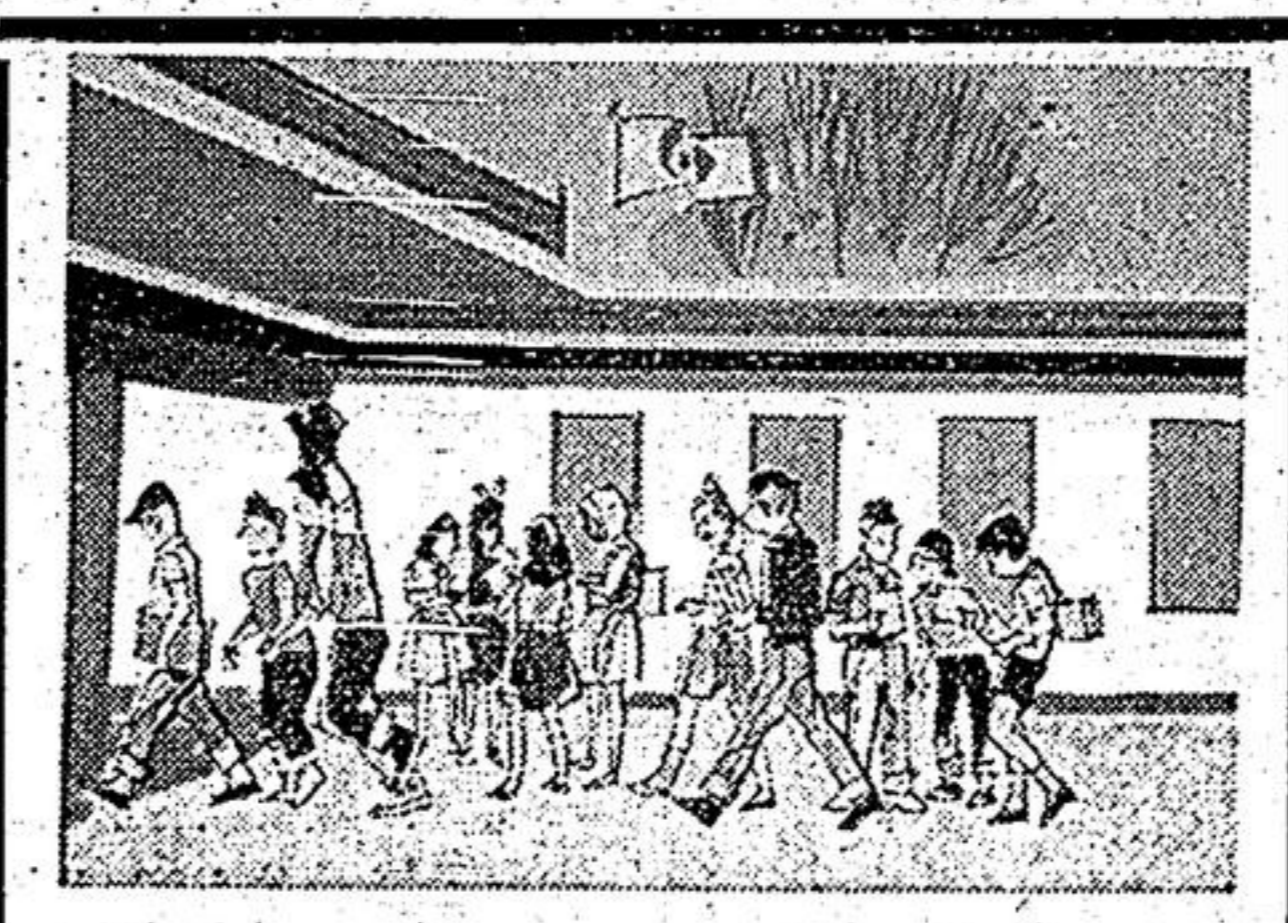
News From Lemonville
