The Pontiac Grande Parisienne, a new series introduced for 1966, is available in two models, sport coupe and sport sedan. The sport coupe has a dramatic new roofline which distinguishes the Grande Parisienne from the rest of the Pontiac line. Grande Parisienne has a luxurious interior, with wood-trimmed instrument panel and steering wheel, and Strato-bucket seats in the sport coupe. New grilles, bumpers, hoods and fenders mark the style change for all Pontiacs and from the roofline back they are completely redesigned. Among new mechanical achievements is a fully-synchronized manual transmission which allows a shift into low without stopping. A new three-speed automatic transmission is also available. The line also introduces new engines and an increased power range.

Beaumont has been restyled for 1966 and offers a brand-new roofline and different rear-window treatment in this Custom sport coupe with sport option. The rear window is recessed and at a different angle than the body lines at the rear. The windshield is also lower and more dramatic in this model. All new for '66 is the four-door sport sedan in the Beaumont Custom series. Both models offer new exterior styling, new interiors and new ornamentation. There is a sport option for both the Custom sport coupe and the Custom convertible and it includes Strato-bucket seats, centre floor console with four-speed transmission or Powerglide, electric clock, wheel trim discs and luxurious interiors. There are nine models in two series of Beaumont for 1966.
