Brougham Farmer Injured in P.T.O. Of Tractor

A Brougham district farmer had a miraculous escape from death last week when caught up in the power takeoff mechanism of his tractor on the farm of Wm. Clarke, near Greenwood.

Mr. Fred Hamilton had all his clothing torn to shreds in a matter of seconds. Fortunately, the tractor was not operating at full speed and the motor stalled. His calls for help were heard by both Mr. and Mrs. Clarke and his son, Ronald, who came immediately to his aid. He was taken to the Medical Centre at Brooklin and then by ambulance to the Oshawa General Hospital where he will be confined several weeks.

Although no bones were broken, he suffered cuts to both legs, an injured spine and multiple bruises.

Wind Blows Car Down 30-ft. Ravine

An accident on Thursday afternoon, blamed on a sudden gust of wind, sent a 1961 model Pontiac and its driver down a 30 foot embankment, two miles west of Gormley, in Markham Twp.

Milo Albert Wood, 40, of Bannockburn, Ont., told police that his auto was thrown out of control by a gust of wind as he reached the top of a hill on the Gormley townline road. It veered across the highway, snapped off a guard post and plummeted down a deep ravine. Damage to the car was estimated at \$150. No one was injured. P.C. Bruce Findlay investigated.

A few minutes earlier Markham police were called to another accident on Steele's Ave. The collision involved cars driven by Margaret Paisley, 30, of R.R.4 Stouffville, and Gretchen Walker, 38, of Willowdale. Damage was estimated at \$375.

Including \$300 to the Paisley car. Charges will be laid against the Willowdale driver. P.C. Albert Hudson investigated.
