Chiropractic Viewpoint

SLIPPED DISC

(Second of two parts) Continuing excerpts from an article written by Dr. James Harvey of The British Medical Association.

"When a disc can protrude into the spinal canal, which holds the spinal cord and the nerve roots which spring from it, pressure on these nerves may cause trouble at once, or some time later, when the original injury has been forgotten. The most common place for this to happen is very low in the back, so that pressure is exerted on the nerves going to the buttocks and the leg. The usual result is an immediate attack of lumbago followed by sciatica down the affected leg.

"In about eighty percent of cases, the complication of injury, followed by sciatica, with stiffness of the back." which makes it difficult to stoop, is due to a slipped disc." The advice of most surgeons, in cases of slipped discs would be not to have an operation until other treatment has been tried for at least a year.
